Structure, governance and management

The charity was established by a constitution adopted on 19 March 2010.

Objectives and activities

To provide relief from sickness and distress, the promotion of and protection of good health and advancing medical education and awareness of physical illness amongst the people of Ghana.

The charity achieves its objectives by the provision of equipment and text books and publishing and distributing information on health issues.

Achievements and performance

The charity has raised money for the vesico vaginal fistula project in Ghana. The charity is keen for the monies to be used for only medical interventions for patients. We have been involved in a dialogue to ensure that happens. We have decided to support named patients, some of whom have complex cases.

The charity has become aware of another team of fistula surgeons in Northern Ghana doing similar work to the surgeons in the capital, Accra. We hope to establish links with them and work with them.

In North Wales, talks have been delivered by Nick Clerk, Dr Naa Barnor and Dr Ernest Awialau to small groups who have been keen to learn more about the fistula project and support the work.

Financial review

Net receipts for the year were £2,194 and cash reserves at the year end stood at £63,541.
