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### Report of the Trustees for the Year Ended 30 June 2019

The trustees present their report along with the financial statements of the charity for the period ended 30 June 2019. The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the accounting policies set out on page 10 and comply with the charity's trust deed and applicable law.

Education West Africa is governed by its trust deed dated 17 March 2009 and obtained charitable status on 18 June 2009.

The management committee, which comprises the trustees have adopted the provisions of the Statement of Recommended Practice (SORP) issued in March 2005 and "Accounting and Reporting by Charities" in preparing the annual report and financial statements of the charity.

### **OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES**

## **Objectives and aims**

Education West Africa is constituted as a charity and governed by its trust deed and charitable objects. The objects of the charity are for the advancement of the education of school pupils in Sierra Leone, particularly through the provision of educational facilities with a view to giving pupils better opportunities in life. Emphasis is placed on the provision of furniture and uniforms together with the training of headteachers.

## ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE

## Achievement and Performance

The need for furniture continues to be an important aspect of the EWA's work. The Education Secretaries in both dioceses are new to post. EWA works closely with them. In Bo, a major review of the schools' needs has been undertaken. Funds have been provided to make a start of supporting the schools deemed to be the neediest.

An outcome of the headteacher conferences has been the identification of the lack of exercise books for the children to work in. This significantly hinders the teachers' assessment of children's achievement and their progress. Consequently, after discussions with the Bishop, Development officer, and Education Secretary in the Diocese of Freetown the feasibility of creating a printing press was investigated. The project would provide income, undertaking commercial printing, which in turn would be used to print exercise free books for schools. A location in the site of the Diocesan headquarters was identified. The Diocese drew up a business plan which EWA has accepted. EWA has identified a donor to fund the project together with some funds from the charity .The foundation stone was laid in February 2019. An oversight committee has been established induding members who have considerable experience in modern printing. The appropriate equipment has been purchased. The printer itself was purchased in the UK and shipped to Freetown. The recruitment of the two operators is in hand by the oversight committee.

The training conferences for headteachers continues. A significant development has been the training and establishment of a planning group for these conferences. The group has nominated headteachers from both dioceses and the Education Secretaries. A major improvement is that the headteachers of both dioceses are working together rather than being separate as they have been in the past.

#### **Investment** performance

The Trust Deed authorises the trustees to make and hold investments using the general funds of the charity, but no such investments are presently held.

## FINANCIAL REVIEW

## **Reserves policy**

Restricted reserves are created when funds are received for a specific purpose. These are analysed in the notes to these accounts showing the incoming resources, those expended and the balance carried forward to be applied in future years.

Other unrestricted funds are used as a buffer to counter the ebb and flow of income and expenditure, which can vary widely from year to year and these are monitored on an ongoing basis.

## STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

## **Governing document**

The charity is controlled by its governing document, a deed of trust, and constitutes an unincorporated charity.

### **Risk management**

The trustees actively review the major risks that the charity faces on a regular basis and believe that maintaining reserves at sufficient levels, combined with an annual review of the controls over the key financial systems, will provide sufficient resources in the event of adverse conditions. The trustees have also examined the other operational and business risks faced by the charity and confirm that they have established systems to mitigate significant risks where they are identified.

## 1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

#### Basis of preparing the financial statements

The financial statements of the charity, which is a public benefit entity under FRS 102, have been prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102) 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2015)', Financial Reporting Standard 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland' and the Charities Act 2011. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

### Income

All income is recognised in the Statement of Financial Activities once the charity has entitlement to the funds, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably.

#### Expenditure

Liabilities are recognised as expenditure as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to that expenditure, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefits will be required in settlement and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably. Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

#### Taxation

The charity is exempt from tax on its charitable activities.

#### Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statements.
