In considering the application of the funds available for distribution, the Committee will bear in mind the wishes of the Testatrix as set out in her Will and which may be summarised and defined as "The Relief of women in need in the area comprising the Dioceses of London, Southwark and Chelmsford by the provision of permanent accommodation, maintenance, holidays and such other means as the Committee shall determine.

Summary of the main activities undertaken for the public benefit in relation to these objects (include within this section the statutory declaration that trustees have had regard to the guidance issued by the Charity Commission on public benefit)

The Foundation achieves this object by the provision of grants. In determining the means by which the Foundation shall achieve its object, the trustees have had regard to the guidance on public benefit issued by the Charity Commission.

During the year under review the Trust awarded 4 grants ranging in value from £7,000.00 to £17,000.00 to a range of charitable organisations and in pursuit of charitable purposes. In the opinion of the trustees the Foundation, by making grants only for charitable purposes as mentioned above, is fulfilling its own obligation to deliver public benefit in the furtherance of its object.

The sum of £3,088 has been expended from the endowment funds and for Charity Commission accounting purposes is now classed as income.

Regular meetings are held by the Trustees where they discuss any applications received and consider which grants they wish to award.
