Alnwick Lions Club (hereafter called the CIO) has been formed to undertake the activities of the Alnwick Lions Charity Trust Fund. Alnwick Lions Charity Trust Fund Reg No 1045968 (hereafter called the Trust). The Trust has been a member of the International Association of Lions Clubs for 44 years (established 1975). Owing to potential problems with the lease, only the non-bookshop activities have been transferred to the CIO. The members of the club are all volunteers who give their time unconditionally in support of charitable causes, both individual and organisations.

New Trustees are inducted and instructed in their duties by the existing experienced trustees. The club is governed as a CIO established 11 May 2018. The club has a board of directors consisting of eight members (with a quorum of five) which is responsible for the execution of the policies approved by the club and the first

at the meeting, subject to there being a quorum of 25% of members in good standing. A quorate meeting of the members and trustees may exercise all its powers which include the management of the charity and the control of the trust fund. The members and trustees may delegate their powers to suitable committees for the trunning of certain aspects of the clubs operations. Grants and donations are made to worthy causes after due diligence to ensure that the cause is bona fide. Potential donees have to fill a request form explaining why they require the financial assistance and some suitable information on the organisation/individual concerned. Section C – Objectives and activities

Objects

The object of the club is to apply its income for any purpose that is charitable according to the current laws of England and Wales. The income will be for the benefit of any individual, group of individuals, organisations or other charities.

The main source of income for the club are transfers from its sister charity, Alnwick Lions Charity Trust Fund, Registration Number 1045968, (hereafter called the Trust). Other sources of income are derived from the running of a car boot sale, coffee mornings and one-off events. The club owns a Santa Sleigh and uses it as a means of collecting donations and is available for local schools and children's groups for the entertainment of children during the Christmas period. The club property of the club is required to be applied in promoting its objects and is vested in the members and trustees for this purpose. No part of the trust shall, however, be applied without approval of the members and trustees in formal meetings and subject to majority voting. The charity has a website detailing the club's activities and achievements annicklions.org.uk.

Section D – Achievements and performance

Summary

Compared with the same activities previously operated under the Trust and excluding Bookshop derived income, income has increased from 2018. Sponsorship and grants (some of which are restricted in nature) have increased by £2875. Net income from social activities (such as a "Murder Night" and "Quiz Night" has improved from 2018 by £1789. Efforts to improve the technology of the Talking Newspaper Service has required increased expenditure of £910 from 2018. Efforts to Expenditure on charitable activities has reduced from 2018 by £1757.

Vection E – Financial review

Policy on reserves

The charity has maintained its financial resources from 2018 and can hope to increase and expand its activities. The charity's reserve requirements have reduced since it no longer funds the bookshop activities. This reserve is required to fund the many one-off charity expenditures and to cover running costs and capital items on activities such as the Talking Newspapers and the car boot sales.

Investment policy

The charity has its cash resources in current bank accounts and does not feel the need to hold any other investments. There is, therefore, little risk from investments.

Preservation of charity assets

The charity's assets are properly insured and the risk minimised in this area.

Hinancial risk

The main risk to the bookshop activities is the failure to acquire a new lease forcing the bookshop to close or relocate.

In common with other Lions Clubs, Alnwick Lions has registered itself as a Charitable Incorporated Organisation (CIO). This is to ensure that the Club can contract in its own name and operates under tighter and more up to date laws and procedures.
