TRUSTEES REPORT FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2019

The trustees present their report along with the financial statements of the charity for the year ended 31 March 2019. The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the accounting policies set out in note 1 to the financial statements and comply with current statutory requirements and the Statement of Recommended Practice – "Accounting and Reporting by Charities" effective January 2015.

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

The principal objects and activities of the charity are:

- 1. To work towards the elimination of racial discrimination.
- 2. To promote equality of opportunity and good relations between persons of different racial groups without distinction of sex, race or political, religious or other opinions.
- 3. To promote and organise co-operation in the achievement of the aforesaid purposes in particular but not exclusively in the area of York.

The trustees confirm that they have referred to the guidance contained in the Charity Commission's general guidance on public benefit when reviewing the charity's aims and objectives, and in planning future activities.

ACHIEVEMENTS AND PERFORMANCE

York Racial Equality Network (YREN) has managed to achieve its core functions this year by providing independent, impartial information and support to individuals who are experiencing racial harassment, discrimination and/or isolation. The organisation has also fulfilled its project requirements. The social and financial climate remains challenging; and, although austerity measures remain, YREN was able to ensure that its vital work continued and the organisation remained financially viable, whilst putting in reduced functions for next year to account for perceived income reductions.

The Comic Relief extension proved successful and gave YREN the opportunity to take a measured approach and exit strategy. Comic Relief were pleased with the outcome of the project as were we. The work was challenging and labour intensive but very rewarding. It identified the importance of YREN's representation work, BME Residents open forums and volunteer recruitment activities along with the high profile equalities training it provided. All grant monitoring and evaluation requirements were met.

The new National Peoples' Health Trust Project, started in May 2018 which embraces cultural diversity and richness through user-led events has proved to be a huge success with numbers exceeding expectations. The user-led events are amongst others aimed at reducing loneliness and isolation and providing volunteers opportunities. The project also provides weekly outreach services and opportunities for partnership work.

YREN is mindful of the Equality Act 2010, which states that those subject to the equality duty must, in the exercise of their functions, have due regard to the need to eliminate unlawful discrimination, harassment and victimisation, advance equality of opportunity between different groups and foster good relations. For this reason, we continue to encourage and support a number of multi-agency, multicultural approaches to race issues, this has been achieved this year through reduced resources, through membership and participation on, the new City-Wide Community Voices initiative, the North Yorkshire Police Central Area Independent Advisory Group, and participation in a number of local groups and forums. YREN has also provided information and resources for individuals, organisations and the general community on race equality issues. We continue to strive to enhance our work by contributing to targeted research and consultation requests, along with providing our own research (for example: YREN's 25th anniversary research report).

TRUSTEES REPORT FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2019 - CONTINUED

FINANCIAL REVIEW

Income reduced from £72,250 in 2018 to £38,465 in 2019 due mainly to a fall in donations and legacies received however expenditure increased from £69,239 in 2018 to £74,463 in 2019 due to a significant increase in legal and professional fees being somewhat offset by a reduction in salary costs. Note 10 to the financial statements shows the assets and liabilities attributable to the various funds by type and notes 6 and 7 describe the various funds of the charity and summarises the year's movement on each fund.

Reserves Policy

Our reserves policy, in line with good financial practice, is to maintain a minimum reserve of six months running costs in case of sudden loss of income or planned, managed closure of the organisation.

STRUCTURE GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

York Racial Equality Network is a registered charity governed by its constitution adopted on 15 December 2000.

The trustees who hold regular meetings administer the charity. Day to day operations are dealt with by the salaried director.

NOTES TO THE ACCOUNTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2019

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of accounting

The charity constitutes a public benefit entity as defined by FRS 102. The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the United Kingdom and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102), issued on 16 July 2014, the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the United Kingdom and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102), the Charities Act 2011, and UK Generally Accepted Practice as it applies from 1 January 2015.

The financial statements have been prepared to give a 'true and fair' view and have departed from the Charities (Accounts and Reports) Regulations 2008 only to the extent required to provide a 'true and fair view'. This departure has involved following the Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) issued on 16 July 2014 (as updated through Update bulletin 1 published 2 February 2016) rather than the Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice effective from 1 April 2005 which has since been withdrawn.

The financial statements are prepared on a going concern basis under the historical cost convention, modified to include certain items at fair value. The financial statements are prepared in sterling which is the functional currency of the charity. The charity has applied update bulletin 1 as published 2 February 2016 and does not include a cashflow statement on the grounds that it is applying FRS 102 section 1A.

The significant accounting policies applied in the preparation of these financial statements are set out below. These policies have been consistently applied to all years presented unless otherwise stated.

Fund accounting

Restricted funds are funds that can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for a specific purpose.

Designated funds are monies set aside by the trustees for particular purposes.

Unrestricted funds are funds which can be used in accordance with the charitable objects at the discretion of the trustees.

Income

All incoming resources are included in the statement of financial activities when the charity is legally entitled to the income and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy.

Expenditure

All expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all costs related to the category.

Fixed assets and depreciation

Tangible fixed assets costing more than £500 are capitalised.

Depreciation of tangible fixed assets is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life:

Computers and equipment - 4 years

Operating leases

Rentals payable under operating leases are charged to the statement of financial activities on a time basis over the lease term.

Tang Hall Big Local Fund

The Tang Hall Big Local Fund Outreach Project provided regular outreach sessions based at Tang Hall Community Centre, including work out in the local area. It primarily targeted local black and minority ethnic residents, but was open to all, who were able to access information and support to address challenges in their lives through face-to-face contact with YREN staff, volunteers and partnership with other organisations such as Your Café and the Tang Hall Advice Hub. These partnerships helped to ensure that the centre is accessible to, and being used by, all those that wish to do so. The project tackled issues of language, culture and confidence in accessing services, and the reduction of social isolation; furthermore, it improved the wider population's understanding of diverse cultures and provided opportunities for local people to act as volunteers, develop new skills and continue the work of the project beyond its period of funding.
