**Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year**

**Achievements**

1. Approval to Increasing Redistribution of surplus food from 1 major local superstore to 2 days Tuesday and Friday to combat food waste and make good quality fresh produce accessible to community members available for the elderly, housebound, low income earners and those struggling with food poverty who live in Beckton and Royal Docks area.
2. Food4Me food redistribution operating from St Marks centre volunteers collect food surplus and lay it on tables for community members to pick up what is available and have access to signposting to specialist agencies if required such as citizens advice bureau, local council community hub etc.
3. Additional volunteer support and with advice from National Autistic society Newham branch to host the term-time Saturday sessions for socially excluded children and speakers to educate parents and children about autism and aspirations
4. Securing a free rental space to run our Wednesday free Space4me health and well-being sessions for parents and young children in Beckton.




