Structure, Governance and Management

Under a constitution adopted on 23rd November 1987, CHYP's objects are "The relief of need, hardship or distress of persons in necessitous circumstances by providing or assisting in the provision of housing in particular, but not exclusively to young persons and in particular, but not exclusively to young persons in Circumstances and the surrounding area". The Charity is a Registered Charity (Number 299821).

Risk Management

The Trustee Board has conducted a review of the major risks to which the charity is exposed. A risk register has been established and is updated at least annually. Where appropriate, systems or procedures have been established to mitigate the risks which the Charity faces. The risk which has been identified as high is the level of grant funding from the local authority funding.

All other risks fall into the low or medium category.

Internal control risks are minimised by the implementation of procedures for authorisation of all transactions and projects. Procedures are in place to ensure compliance with health and safety of staff, volunteers, clients and visitors to our premises.
