- To proactively uphold, implement and embed the aims of the Inclusive Mosque Initiative in its activities as stated in its Statement of Intent;
- 2. To maintain and conduct the religious and educational affairs of the Mosque;
- To conduct ceremonies, congregations and meetings of a religious and cultural nature under the guidance of the organisation's aims, Imams and Management Committee;
- 4. To teach the spirit, culture, philosophy, ethics and fundamentals of Islam, with a view to improving the moral, intellectual and social condition of Muslims in their community;
- 5. To expand the knowledge of Islam through discussions and Islamic literature by means of publishing and distributing such literature electronically and physically, and provide an Islamic resource facility for communities at large;
- To engage nationally and internationally with issues of social, economic and political justice, to promote the welfare of all living beings.

During the period April 2018 to March 2019, Inclusive Mosque Initiative (IMI), have continued to provide safe and inclusive places of worship and spiritual practice, centring and uplifting the voices and experiences of marginalised people within our communities. To this end we have run a range of spiritual events, social justice programmes, consultations and promoted our work with various media outlets and journalists that we trust.

Summary of the main activities undertaken for the public benefit in relation to these objects (include within this section the statutory declaration that trustees have had regard to the guidance issued by the Charity Commission on public benefit)

IMI has delivered free and regular jummah prayers, Ramadan programmes including iftars and taraweh, as well as Muharram reflections and Eid events. We have continued our 'Inclusive Halaqa' event that brings together inclusive theology and spiritual practice.

IMI has continued to build capacity, including the recruiting and training imams to deliver religious services, conduct Islamic (often same sex) marriages and deliver blessings. This recruitment and training has meant additional revenue for the organisation and supported the leadership of marginalised Muslims.

The strengthening of our administrative role into a full project manager position, funded by Arcus Foundation and Joseph Rowntree Charitable Trust (JRCT) has enabled us to deliver much higher quality work and allow our events to reach a much wider audience.

Section D

Achievements and performance

Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year

Our primary project for the period was the Raise Your Gaze (RYG) programme, funded by Joseph Rowntree Charitable Trust (JRCT). This involved curating three large scale conferences in partnership with a range of organisations, individuals and partners. The impact of the project resulted in IMI being named one of The Observer and Nesta's 50 New Radicals, (theguardian.com/world/2018/sep/16/new-radicals-2018-raise-your-gaze-muslim-feminists-mosque).

Selected feedback from the RYG events:

RYG4, Sexual Diversity In Islam (May 2018)-

In June 2018, IMI ran a consultation, to open a process for people with lived experience of disability to have the opportunity to shape IMI's approach to accessibility. This was funded by the Arcus Foundation and produced a range of policies, resources and training.

In March 2019, supported by Free Word, IMI presented a discussion on the representation of female and non-binary Muslim voices in recitation of the Quran. This included the launch of a digital sound installation of women and non-binary recitations of the Quran.

During the period, IMI was invited to two key international conferences:

- Muslim Women's Religious Leadership and Authority in Europe and North America, University of Edinburgh, September 2018
- Learning Exchange: Combating Hate and Islamophobia organised by Unbound Philanthropy with Social Change Initiative, Washington, March 2019
