REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2019

The trustees who are also directors of the charity for the purposes of the Companies Act 2006, present their report with the financial statements of the charity for the year ended 31 December 2019. The trustees have adopted the provisions of Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2015).

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Objectives and aims

The Charity's objectives are for the benefit of the public to promote the efficiency of Christian based charities in the furtherance of their objectives, or any one of them, mainly but not exclusively by the provision of information, advice, support and infrastructure provision; and the relief of financial hardship, either generally or individually, through the provision of grants, goods or services.

Significant activities

Activity and focus in 2019

Diane Watts continued her excellent work as the Development Worker and continued her work scoping and networking across the Diocese of Chichester to ascertain the range of social action activities already taking place by the Church of England and other denominational groups. This resulted in regular reports to the trustees and recommendations in relation to areas of concern or gaps in provisions that she was able to identify. She also explored opportunities for collaboration with local councils and other secular charities and community groups.

Areas identified for monitoring and potential project generation remained as described in the 2018 report and included the following:

- Homelessness and night shelter/hostel and day centre provision
- Mental Health and wellbeing of vulnerable groups
- Loneliness and isolation in urban and rural settings
- Provision of new housing areas and the challenge of community building for those new to a community
- Food & fuel poverty and the action of food banks
- Slavery and exploitation of recent immigrants and other vulnerable groups
- Debt and financial exploitation

Diane continued to deliver some training programmes to local churches including Know Your Church, Know Your Neighbourhood workshops, involvement with the Clewer Initiative on human trafficking and slavery, the Places of Welcome initiative and the start up of Renew Wellbeing Cafés. She produced regular newsletters and produced recommendations for the trustees to consider.

A principal recommendation was that assistance in the area of mental health and wellbeing was a request from many churches. To this end the trustees employed Elle Weaver as a mental health and wellbeing advisor on 4th February 2019 on a part-time basis. Elle will focus on training churches in good mental health practice and developing a mental health quality mark for churches.

Towards the end of 2019 an opportunity arose to collaborate with the NHS and a neighbouring diocese to employ a Hear Here Coordinator to assist churches in caring for those who are hard of hearing and training and appointing Hear Here champions to help with hearing aid maintenance. Accordingly Amber Jackson was employed on 1st December 2019 in this role on a part-time basis.

The year ended with Diane's resignation from Together in Sussex to take up a role with the Baptist Union heading up their social welfare work. The trustees are grateful for her work with us in establishing Together in Sussex and are making plans to continue this important work.

Together is Sussex is not a grant making body, but exists instead to encourage, support and otherwise resource local community and church groups to engage with the above and other social challenges that may uniquely and variously occur in local settings. Together in Sussex offers opportunities for networking, resource and expertise sharing and can act as a broker between various groups wishing to address similar issues.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2019

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of preparing the financial statements

The financial statements of the charitable company, which is a public benefit entity under FRS 102, have been prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102) 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2015)', Financial Reporting Standard 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland' and the Companies Act 2006. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

Income

All income is recognised in the Statement of Financial Activities once the charity has entitlement to the funds, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably.

Expenditure

Liabilities are recognised as expenditure as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to that expenditure, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefits will be required in settlement and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably. Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

Tangible fixed assets

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off the cost less estimated residual value of each asset over its estimated useful life.

Computer equipment - 25% on cost

Taxation

The charity is exempt from corporation tax on its charitable activities.

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statements.

Pension costs and other post-retirement benefits

The charitable company operates a defined contribution pension scheme. Contributions payable to the charitable company's pension scheme are charged to the Statement of Financial Activities in the period to which they relate.
