Chair's Report for the 2017/2018 Academic Year

The Tiptoe Butterflies Pre-school Annual General Meeting (AGM) is conducted in the November of each year in order to review the previous academic year and to welcome new parents to the pre-school and onto the Committee.

Tiptoe Butterflies continues to offer excellent provision of pre-school learning to the local community. With 23 children on the register in September 2017, increasing to 32 by July 2018. The welcoming nature of the setting, the excellent range of activities and the flexibility in drop off and pick up times has been key to our success. Not to mention the fun and professional attitude of all the staff who make the pre-school such a success. This last year has also seen upgraded and new equipment inside and out.

Staff quality is of an excellent level, with good staff retention. No one has left the setting this year and one new member of staff has joined, Tracey Watkins joined us in April as a qualified pre-school assistant, with lots of experience working with pre-school age children and older age children within schools. Tracey has already completed her probation period and moved to a permanent contract in September.

Whilst this was not one of the pre-schools most affluent of years, we are still most definitely on a sound financial footing and looking forward to building upon this. Fundraising continues to perform strongly which is testament to the staff interaction with parents but also the support that the parents of the pre-school give us. These events enable the pre-school to maintain the high level of quality aids for learning with the children.

Whilst 2016/2017 academic year did not see a pay rise for staff members due to a 2 year pay rise deal being implemented in a previous academic year. This was reviewed in April 2018 and all members of staff received a pay rise, using the new minimum wage as a baseline, and keeping percentage increases the same across the board.

Tiptoe Butterflies also received a visit from Ofsted in May. This was a very successful visit where the setting and staff achieved an excellent write up from Ofsted, the report was lovely to read and fully deserved, reflecting the excellent work they put in. The Ofsted report gave the setting a standard of Good.

The Committee continues to be an area of concern in terms of membership and representation from parents, however, we are working hard to inform parents of the importance of our Committee and the ease at which it is to join.

I would like to thank the staff, committee and parents for their continued support and hard work in making Tiptoe Butterflies Pre-school a successful and happy setting for all.

Supervisors report 2018

Another fantastic year at Butterflies with lots going on and exciting plans for the forthcoming months. It has been great to have all of the outside area accessible through the summer and the children had a great time using all of our new resources that we purchased with the Tesco grant. There has been some renovation to the inside of the hall too, as the church have fitted a new carpet and flooring in the main hall which has updated its tired appearance. Our vegetable patch has flourished and the children have grown their own sunflowers, pumpkins and lots of different vegetables which we have eaten at snack time. This has been a fantastic way to promote healthy eating in the preschool.

Are numbers for this term are healthy and we're are seeing a high demand for sessions for two year olds at the setting. We are looking to offer a Monday afternoon to meet this increasing demand. The church have agreed to let us have the hall so we are now just asking parents when they would like to start, it's looking like after half term.

We have purchased some new resources that are particularly suitable for two year olds and these are being accessed by them well.

We have welcomed new children and their families to the preschool and are looking forward to our nativity and Christmas mingle as a way of getting to know them all better. We are very excited to be welcoming some elderly residents from a local care home this year. They will be coming in to the preschool to watch our nativity, which we hope will benefit both them and the children tremendously.

We have had some really successful fund raising events this year including our sponsored bike ride, sports day and prize draw.

We have welcomed a new member of our team, Tracey, who has come to us with a wealth of experience and a real love for early years. She is fantastic with the children and has instantly become a very valued addition.

All staff have successfully completed their first aid training.

Tiptoe Butterflies had another successful Ofsted inspection, where we were rated as good. We were very happy with this. We have suggestions to work towards and are confident that these are achievable.

The preschool continues to be a busy and happy place where the children thrive, learn and prepare for their next steps towards school. The team are enthusiastic and committed to providing the best care and education for the children and I feel that they are the reason for Butterflies success.

This coming term is a busy one for us with lots to look forward to. We have our pumpkin party and all things Christmassy!!
