CHAIRMAN'S REPORT for year ending 31st December, 2018

The Trust has had another successful year in offering our services to those that need them within the Parish of Prestbury. Although the numbers fluctuate as we are serving the elderly, this usually remains about 200. It is increasingly difficult to guarantee numbers for the services we provide as we often have late cancellations. All are generally well supported except the Knit and Natter (arts & crafts) Group which struggles with just a handful. However, the move from Prestbury Village Hall to the Library has worked out well as it is warmer and there is no need to get tables and chairs out.

The Lunch Club and Exercise Groups are well supported and this year's Christmas Tea Party, which was very well organised by Bob Conolly, was declared the best ever.

Jane Banwell continues with her fund raising which has been most successful again this year with social functions and applying for grants.

The Friendship Group continues with their Birthday visits and arranging coach tours with a WI tea which are most popular but sometimes there is difficulty in filling the coach. My sincere thanks to Gloria Gmys and her volunteers for running this group.

The minibus continues to be well used but has required some repairs during the year. Thanks to Nigel Woodcock for assiduously keeping a close eye on the 'bus and with Jenny Roden, our warden, organising repairs, checks and cleaning. The twice weekly shopping trips are very well used with the 'bus and volunteer drivers.

Following last year's extensive refurbishment, redecoration and new floor coverings to number 10 Deep Street there has been little need for expenditure on the properties other than normal servicing and maintenance. Sadly, our tenant in 10A, John Hannis, is terminally ill and next year we will need to completely clean, redecorate and bring it up to current standards for letting. We have hardly spent anything on 10A in the last 14 years.

Our finances are in good state following the generous legacy we received and the fund raising. We will have considerable expense next year on 10A and as with everyone the return on our investments has been considerably less in recent years.

Our part time warden Jenny Roden continues to do sterling work in making visits where necessary helping to organise and run various groups and endeavouring to recruit more people that we can help. A very big thank you to her, all the committee and the numerous volunteers that help us in various ways and without whom we could not provide all the services that we do.
