The Trustees present their annual report and the unaudited financial statements for the year ended 5 April 2019. The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the accounting policies set out in note 1 to the accounts and comply with the charity's trust deed, the Charities Act 2011 and Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland published on 16 July 2014.

Structure, Governance and Management

The Charitable Trust is governed by a Declaration of Trust dated 7 April 1986.

The power of appointing new or additional Trustees is vested in Trevor Osborne during his life, and thereafter by resolution of the Trustees.

Objectives and Activities for the public benefit

The object of the Charitable Trust is to pay or apply the income and, in some circumstances, the capital of the Trust to registered charities or for exclusively charitable purposes according to the law of England and Wales, at the discretion of the Trustees.

Donations received by the Charitable Trust are utilised to achieve the above objectives.

The Trust continues to lease a converted former lifeboat house. The Trust lets this as The Lifeboat Art Studio, and is made available to artists and students from universities, local and national community groups and others as an arts resource to teach, learn, paint and create other art and exhibit. The accommodation is made available for these purposes and whilst some groups are allowed the space free of charge some charges are applied to individuals in order to recover some of the running costs of the property. The intention is to encourage arts and culture for all age groups and through the local community.

The Trust continues to lease the ground, first and second floors of Hardwick Hall, Buxton. Hardwick Hall is currently occupied by a community company, Bridgehead Arts Ltd (trading as The Green Man Gallery), which runs the community arts hub and gallery – a not for profit organisation. Their occupation of the premises requires them to pay the usual outgoings but because of their charitable aims, the rent charged is just one peppercorn per annum. In addition, it is the venue for the annual Buxton Spa Prize which is not for profit and is intended to boost the local economy and the community of Buxton by bringing artists to the town and incentivising the arts background which is a community benefit.

The Trust has taken on a tenancy of Net Loft, Porthleven in the year. The Trust lets this to six artists to use and promote charitable and artistic purposes with the intention to advance community activities by the residents of Porthleven.

The Trustees confirm that they have referred to the Charity Commission's general guidance on public benefit when reviewing the Charitable Trust's aims and objectives, in planning future activities and setting the grant making policy for the year.

Achievements and Performance

Details of expenses paid for charitable events and charitable donations made to further the Charitable Trust's purposes for the public benefit are given in notes 4 and 5 to the financial statements.

Reserves policy

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

FOR THE YEAR ENDED 5 APRIL 2019

1. Accounting policies

Basis of preparation and assessment of gong concern

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention with items recognised at cost or transaction value unless otherwise stated in the relevant notes to these accounts. The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with Statement of Recommended Practice: Accounting and Reporting by Charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) issued on 16 July 2014 and the Charities Act 2011.

The charity constitutes a public benefit entity as defined by FRS 102.

The trustees consider that there are no material uncertainties about the Trust's ability to continue as a going concern.

The significant accounting policies applied in the preparation of these financial statements are set out below. These policies have been consistently applied to all years presented values unless otherwise stated.

Fund accounting policy

Unrestricted income funds are general funds that are available for use at the trustees' discretion in furtherance of the objectives of the charity. The trustees aim to maintain positive reserves in unrestricted funds by managing the level of donations and grants awarded to ensure that resources expended do not exceed incoming resources. Details of the fund is disclosed in note 10.

Incoming recognition

All income is recognised once the charity has entitlement to the income, it is probable that the income will be received, and the amount of the income can be measured reliably.

Donations are recognised when the charity has been notified in writing of both the amount and the settlement date. In the event that a donation is subject to conditions that require a level of performance before the charity is entitled to funds, the income is deferred and not recognised until either those conditions are met, or the fulfilment of those conditions is wholly within the control of the charity.

Incoming resources from tax reclaims are recognised at the same time as the donation to which it relates.

Income from the operation of the Lifeboat Art Studio and Net Loft is recognised in the period to which it relates.

Expenditure recognition

Liabilities are recognised as expenditure as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to that expenditure, it is probable that the settlement will be required, and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably.

All expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis inclusive of irrecoverable VAT. All expenditure including governance costs are allocated to the applicable expenditure headings.

Donations payable are payments made to third parties in the furtherance of the charitable objects of the Trust. In the case of an unconditional donation this is accrued once the recipient has been notified of the grant award. The notification gives the recipient a reasonable expectation that they will receive the donation. Donations awarded that are subject to the recipient fulfilling performance conditions are only accrued when the recipient has been notified of the donation and any remaining unfulfilled conditions have been met.

Governance costs

Governance costs comprise all costs involving the public accountability of the charity and its compliance with regulation and good practice.

Debtors

Debtors are measured on initial recognition at settlement amount after any trade discounts or amount advanced by the charity. Subsequently, they are measured at the cash or other consideration expected to be received.

Creditors

The charity has creditors which are measured at settlement amount less any trade discounts.

Hardwick Hall is owned by Trevor Osborne Property Group Ltd and is let to the trust at £1,200 per annum which has been assessed by T Osborne, the settlor, a Chartered Surveyor, to be at open market value. No rent was paid in the year as agreed between the two parties.

Net Loft is owned by Saracen House Estates Ltd and is let to the trust at £3,600 per annum which has been assessed by T Osborne, the settlor, a Chartered Surveyor, to be at open market value.

The lease agreements are within the course of the companies' normal business, and the terms of all leases are not considered to be detrimental to the trust.
