1. Introduction

This report sets out the progress made by the Thursby Sport & Recreation Committee (hereafter referred to as 'the Charity') during the financial year 2018-19.

The report sets out the progress made during the year in terms of activities and progress on major projects, but also provides a summary of the financial and governance arrangements for the year.

2. Activities during the Financial Year

The main focus of activity during the period has been to: -

- Establish continued regular usage of the site;
- Embed processes and procedures for the safe operation of the site;
- Continue to raise the profile of the site within the local community;
- Secure the necessary investment to complete the new play area development project.

Further details of these are outlined in more details below: -

Establishing Regular Usage

From August 2018 we embarked upon our second season of football being played on the site. The on-going agreement with Dalston Junior Black Reds have seen 2 x under 8, 1 x under 10, 1 x under 12, and 2 x under 14 teams play regular fixtures at the site. The Ship Inn FC adult men's team have also used the site for home fixtures during the season, however, due to low numbers of players, this team folded in December 2018, and no subsequent Sunday morning team has able to be found to play on the site at this time. We have also seen occasional usage by Nelson Thomlinson School. A total of 98 competitive matches were played on the site during the 2018-19 season.

Other users have also included Thursby Primary School during the Spring Term 2019 for their after school football club, as well as a local schools cross country competition, and a Chance Camp event referenced later in this report.

This has resulted in throughput figures for football alone of 2444 participants, 401 volunteers, and 2441 spectators being present at matches during the season. A further 150 participants have taken part in the cross country event and the Chance Camp on the site.

These figures do not include the many hundreds of visits made to the site for social and recreational play and football activities which takes place every day. The Committee are pleased to see the facility being used so widely by the community.

Develop Fit for Purpose Processes for Safe Operation of the Site

The Charity has worked hard with partners during this second year of operation to ensure that the users are able to do so safely. Things that have been considered have included: -

- Information on security to user groups;
- Issuing and registering of keys;
- Grounds maintenance and grass cutting arrangements;
- Monitoring health and safety and defects;

This will be an on-going process, and will be picked up by the Committee moving forward. It's disappointing to report that there has been a small number of low level vandalism incidents throughout the year, these issues have been publicised on the playing fields Facebook page, and in the local parish magazine. In all cases the issues have been resolved without the need to inform the Police.

Raising the Profile of the site within the local Community

Chance Camp

The Charity also held a 'fun on the field' event during the summer of 2018 for the children of the village to enjoy a range of fun activities, provided in partnership with Chance Camp, a local sports development company. 16 children attended the event, and we will look to run similar events next year.

Fundraising Events

To continue to raise the profile of the Charity in the local community, and to raise much needed funds, a series of fundraising events were organised over the course of the year. These events are invaluable in spreading the message about the aims and objectives of the Charity, and also help to galvanise support from the community. Events this year have included a race Night, Burns Night Supper, Live Music Night, Curry Night, as well as providing the refreshments at a Table Top Sale.

3. Financial Information

A full financial report is available on request. Summary details are as follows: -

Income was again higher than normal due to the numerous grant applications made for the play area development project, and was a figure of £35,227 for the year. Total expenditure, which was mainly revenue expenditure linked to on-going servicing of the site and the fundraising activities, coupled with a final retention payment to the contractor for the pavilion and store development project was £12,866. This resulted in an increase in balances from a figure of £10,119 at 1 April 2018 to a figure of £32,480 as at 31 March 2019.

The fundraising activities by the Charity, highlighted earlier raised a healthy net figure of £5,689 during the period; events included a Burns Night Supper, Live Music Night, Race Night, and a Curry Night.

It was also pleasing to note an increased financial contribution being received through Thursby Parish Council. A report was prepared for the Council meeting in September 2018 seeking additional support, and following discussions, it has been agreed that the Council will support the Charity to the value of £3,000 each year moving forward. This development is seen as vitally important to help the long term sustainability of the Charity, as well as recognition from the Council of the vital role physical activity, and the provision of high quality local facilities can play in supporting the community to be healthy and well. Moving into 2019-20, the Committee will be undertaking a full review of the financial situation, as they have undergone a full year of operating the facility. A review of the current charging policies will also be undertaken.

4. Trustees

The Charity has maintained its current number of Trustees from the previous year.

All of the required funding, in the region of £77,000 is now in place to complete the new play area development project. A main contractor, Playdale Ltd, has been appointed, and it is expected that the new play area will be installed in June 2019.

Once installed, the Charity will look to hold an official opening event, to celebrate the final piece of the Facility Development Plan being achieved.
