

SECTION B: STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

The Ashton-under-Lyne Methodist Circuit is part of the Methodist Church of Great Britain

- takes professional advice when it is required.
- follows procedures and guidelines issued by the Methodist Church to mitigate risks.
- adopts and implements the Methodist Church's robust Safeguarding Policies and procedures, in the Circuit and the local churches, (updated annually).

SECTION C: OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Summary of the objects of the charity set out in its governing document:

The purposes of the Methodist Church are and shall be deemed to have been since the date of Union:

- (a) The advancement of the Christian faith in accordance with the doctrinal standards and the discipline of the Methodist Church.
- (b) Any charitable purpose for the time being of any Connexional, District, Circuit, local or other organisation of the Methodist Church.
- (c) Any charitable purpose for the time being of any society or institution subsidiary or ancillary to the Methodist Church.
- (d) Any purpose for the time being of any charity being a charity subsidiary or ancillary to the Methodist Church.

Summary of the main activities undertaken for public benefit in relation to these objects:

We confirm that the trustees have regard to the Charity Commission's guidance on public benefit, including the specific guidance on charities for the advancement of religion.

The Trustees are committed to reaching out to as many people as possible in the Circuit's geographical area, through regular worship at the seven member churches which provide pastoral care and community activities as part of their outreach, and also through regular children's and family activities. The Circuit funded the provision of two Presbyters, one Supernumerary Presbyter (part-time) and one Supernumerary Deacon (part-time) and covered their legitimate expenses. It also supplied and maintained accommodation for two Presbyters (manses). There were five other non-stipendiary Supernumerary Ministers in Circuit plus the services of a URC Minister (part-time at Trinity Audenshaw LEP). The Circuit also employs a part-time administrator (15 hours per week).

The Circuit produces a quarterly preaching plan to ensure that regular acts of worship (open to all), take place at each of the seven churches, Dukinfield, Hurst, Mossley, Stalybridge, Trinity Audenshaw, Waterloo and West End. Trinity Audenshaw is a Local Ecumenical Partnership with the United Reformed Church.

The Circuit also supports the community through Chaplaincy at:

- · Rosehill Methodist Primary Academy,
- · Tameside Hospital
- Ashton-under-Lyne Town Centre, Asda and a number of other community venues.

Vision for the way ahead

As part of its Mission and Outreach the Circuit Meeting proposed that three named people should be encouraged and trained as voluntary Local Lay Pastors, one in the area of Godly Play and two in Youth Emmaus. Further people will be encouraged to become involved with this work, as the scheme progresses.

Mossley Methodist Church launched the Holy Habits programme at Pentecost 2018. This was a 2 year programme and has continued to run through 2018/19 with the aim of deepening discipleship. They continue to involve as wide a range of people from the church and community as possible.

Hurst Methodist Church and Waterloo Methodist Church are supporting one another in joint worship activities as well as developing the work at Rosehill Academy. A Godly Play Space was commissioned at Hurst Methodist Church in July 2019.

It had been hoped that Stalybridge Methodist Church and Dukinfield Methodist Church would develop closer links however this has not happened and each church continues to worship separately

Trinity Audenshaw Church (LEP with URC) and West End Methodist Church continue to try to develop ways of supporting and working together, although continue to worship separately.

Several changes had been proposed in Circuit staffing in August 2019. Rev Julie Coates time as Superintendent Minister ended, however as a full time replacement Superintendent could not be found, Rev Stephen Heath and Deacon Jenny Heath, whose appointments were also due to end, were invited to continue until September 2020. As Circuit has been in discussions with Glossop and Hyde and Denton Circuits with a view to possible merger (see page 4 of this report), the lack of a Superintendent minister is to be covered by Rev Hazel Cook, currently Superintendent in the Glossop Circuit. A proposal to restructure Circuit into to two sections in September 2019 was therefore modified, so that Rev Cook will have responsibility for Stalybridge. Dukinfield, Trinity, and West End will be covered by Rev Stephen Heath and Deacon Jenny Heath. Rev Karen Hilsden will have pastoral charge of Mossley, Hurst, Waterloo and the Chaplaincy of Rosehill Academy from September 2019 for her final year in the Circuit.

In 2014, because of reduction in staffing levels, the Circuit was given permission by The Methodist Connexion to sell two manses as a replacement project with a view to purchasing one more appropriately sited and equipped manse. Circuit had 5 years complete this process which it did in July 2019 with the purchase of

Durham Drive manse in which Rev Karen Hilsden now resides. In 2018/19 as a further development of the restructuring process it was agreed by Managing Trustees to sell both Hanover Street manse in Mossley and Lakes Road manse in Dukinfield, as they would become empty at the end of the 2019 Connexional Year.

Discussions with Hyde & Denton Circuit and Glossop Circuit

At the request of the Manchester & Stockport Methodist District Council conversations have been ongoing with the neighbouring Circuits of Hyde & Denton and Glossop regarding a review of existing Circuit boundaries and the potential for regrouping as one Circuit, Glossop and Tameside, in September 2020. Joint Staff meetings, Joint Circuit Leadership Team Meetings, and Leaders' of Worship and Local Preachers' Meetings have been held. Training for Pastoral Visitors, Worship Leaders and Safeguarding is also being arranged in consultation with all three Circuits.

Ecumenical Links

The work at Trinity Church, Local Ecumenical Partnership with the United Reformed Church continues to develop. Members at Hurst also continue to work closely with the Albion URC Fellowship – this includes shared worship at Christmas and Easter as well as regular study group meetings.

Stamford Street Methodist Hall and Car Park

The sale of this property was completed in January 2019.

The contents of the building have been rehomed in churches around the Circuit and the local community. One memorial tablet to local airmen will be rehoused at Hurst Methodist Church. Many Bibles and hymn books have been donated to a charity which uses them in developing countries.

The following is a summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year:

• The Circuit's Children's and Youth Work Forum (CYF), has continued to meet regularly to plan a range of activities across the Circuit with successful events such as holiday clubs which have benefitted many children and families, both in the church and wider community. These have included working with Andy Silver and POP UK at the Mega Quest holiday club at Mossley Methodist Church. There was also 'The Greatest Showman' holiday club at Dukinfield Methodist Church. The Circuit led a Lego-themed activity day – 'Brick by Brick' – at Rosehill Methodist Primary Academy in February 2019.

A number of children and youth from the Circuit also attended the 3Generate Methodist Youth Conference in Southport in November 2018, this included three pupils from Rosehill

- The Circuit Junior & Youth Emmaus groups continued to develop well under the guidance of Rev
 Karen Hilsden. They have engaged in events both locally and nationally, such as Soul Survivor, and a
 Circuit Youth weekend retreat at the Westwood Christian Centre in April. Emmaus also holds
 contemporary worship once a month at Hurst Methodist Church.
- Chaplaincy remains central to the Circuit's ethos with great emphasis on Tameside Hospital, Rosehill Methodist Primary Academy (see below), The Carpenter's Arms and retailers in Ashton-under-Lyne town centre.
- The Circuit Missions Committee campaigned and raised funds for Mission in Britain, World Mission through a special Easter Offering Service.
- All Circuit Churches were encouraged to become involved with activities during Fairtrade Fortnight in February 2019.
- Throughout Bible Month in June 2019 the Circuit planned all its preachers to use the Book of Colossians.
- As part of Barbara Glasson's (President Designate), walk to the Methodist Conference in Birmingham she stopped-over at Dukinfield on 15th June. There was a Blessing Service for Barbara and her fellow walkers on Sunday 16th, at Dukinfield, prior to their setting off on the next leg of their walk.

 The Circuit held support meetings for church officers e.g. Treasurers and Safeguarding Officers during the year.

Rosehill Methodist Primary Academy

On 1st December 2018, Rosehill Methodist Primary School converted to Academy status. It was the second school to convert to an academy with the Wesley Trust. Rev'd Julie Coates continued as Chaplain. Over the year Rosehill achieved the following:

- There was a Covenant Service for staff after school on Tuesday 15th January 2019.
- Four pupils worked through a training programme to become Junior Worship Leaders.
- Each year group was 'twinned' with a different church within the Ashton Circuit for learning, support and prayer.
- Year 5 pupils started visiting Mossley Methodist Community Day Centre once a term to build intergeneration relationships with the clients.
- Circuit Ministers led a staff meeting about Godly Play. This method of storytelling has now been incorporated into the RE curriculum, with volunteers from the Circuit helping to deliver the stories.
- Pupils from the Reception Classes attended an Easter Celebration at Hurst Methodist Church when they were all given their own 'Holy Week in a box' – a report of this initiative featured in the Methodist Recorder.
- Artwork by the pupils was displayed at Mossley Methodist Church over the summer holidays.

Circuit Policies and Safeguarding

The Trustees have reviewed and approved all Circuit Policies at June Circuit Meeting. The Circuit Safeguarding policy was also approved and is in line with the Methodist Church guidelines and undertaken to encourage all those church members who work with children and young people and vulnerable adults to undertake Methodist Church Creating Safer Space Training, a process which is ongoing.

General Data Protection Regulations (GDPR)

The Circuit continue to comply with GDPR using the guidance offered by TMCP and the Methodist Church.

Brief statement of the charity's policy on reserves:

The Reserves Policy for the Circuit is based on holding a sum equivalent to 3 months' average expenditure, which is regarded as sufficient to meet any unforeseen item of major expenditure on manses and/or to be able to continue (in the short term) funding planned activities in the event of the closure of a large church or an inability to raise the full Circuit Assessment from churches. 

Notes to the Accounts

1. Basis of accounting

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS102) issued on 16 July 2014 (as updated through Update Bulletin 1 published on 2 February 2016 and also Update Bulletin 2 published on 5 October 2018) – (Charities SORP (FRS 102)), the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) and the Companies Act 2006.

2. Funds

The funds held constitute: General Funds held for any purpose of the Circuit which are Unrestricted. The Circuit Model Trust Fund has wide purposes defined in Standing Orders and is categorised as unrestricted. Restricted funds which are held for a narrower purpose. There are also Endowment funds as listed. Details of each material fund are disclosed in the final notes to these accounts. Any funds may be represented by more than just cash.

3. Accounting policies

Basis

These accounts have been prepared on the basis of historical cost except that investments are shown at their market value at the end of the year, on the accruals basis to show a true and fair view of the Circuit's financial position and activities.

Income Recognition

Income is included in the Statement of Financial Activities (SOFA) when the Circuit becomes entitled to the resources, the trustees are reasonably certain they will receive the resources, and the monetary value can be measured with sufficient reliability.

Resources Expended

This is recognised when a liability is incurred, or a constructive obligation arises, that results in the payment being unavoidable. Liabilities are recognised as soon as an outflow of economic benefit is considered more likely than not under the legal or constructive obligation committing the Circuit to pay out resources.

Grants

Grants made by the Circuit from its own funds are recognised in full at the time of agreement or when the Circuit accepts that there is a legal or operational obligation to make the payment. When the grant is recurrent over more than one year the balance payable in future years is treated as a provision for future commitments in the Balance Sheet against the appropriate fund, the provision being released in future years as instalments are paid in accordance with the originally agreed terms.

VAT

Since the Circuit is not VAT registered, all input VAT is charged with the expenses to which it refers.

Tangible fixed assets for use by the Circuit

These are capitalised if they can be used for more than one year, and individually cost at least £1.000. Land and buildings value is shown in the accounts at valuation on purchase or as assessed in 2017.

Investment Properties

Investment properties - no property is currently deemed not to be held for the long term purposes of the charity.

Investments

Investments are valued in the balance sheet at market value at the year end. Investment income is included in the accounts when receivable and any gains or losses on revaluation at the year end are shown in the SOFA.

Debtors and Prepayments

Debtors include any outstanding assessment payments due and pre-payments for insurance and manse utilities.

Creditors

Creditors include both sundry expenses and ministers stipends, and also specifically the September church assessments received in August each year.

The funds that support the Circuit Model Trust Fund (and any Manses Funds) are held by TMCP (The Trustees For Methodist Church Purposes) in Trustees Interest Funds on which interest is credited to the accounts each quarter. These are regarded as medium and long term investments.

TMCP is the legal owner and Custodian Trustee of all Methodist Model Trust property, including Legacies, Endowments and Accumulated Funds. Trust property is held for and on behalf of local Managing Trustees who are responsible for the day to day management of trust property. TMCP ensure that, through providing guidance and acting under their direction, the Managing Trustees comply with charity law and Methodist law and policy as determined by the Methodist Conference.
