Structure, Governance and Management

The charity is a public benefit entity.

The charity is controlled by its governing document, a declaration of trust, and constitutes an unincorporated body.

The fund has been running for many years, and was registered with the Charity Commission on 17 February 2012.

The trustees receive financial, legal and secretarial support and advice from Kingston upon Hull City Council.

Trustees

There must be at least four trustees, appointed by a resolution of the trustees passed at a special meeting.

The trustees shall all be trustees ex officio. When the postholders (who are the Lord Mayor and Deputy Lord Mayor) change then the new postholders and their consorts will be appointed by the continuing trustees as their replacements.

Each trustee on their appointment is given a copy of the deed together with any amendments made to it and a copy of the latest charity report and statement of accounts.

Objectives

The objects of the charity are to further such charitable purposes that fall within the description of charitable purposes set out in Part 1 of the Charities Act 2006 listed as:

The prevention or the relief of poverty

The advancement of education

The advancement of religion

The advancement of health or the saving of lives

The advancement of citizenship or community development

The advancement of the arts, culture, heritage or science

The advancement of human rights, conflict resolution or reconciliation or the promotion of religious or racial harmony or equality or diversity

The advancement of environmental protection or improvement

The relief of those in need, by reason of youth, age, ill health, disability, financial headship, or other disadvantage

The advancement of animal welfare

Donations totalling £12,985 were also received.

The promotion of the efficiency of the armed forces of the Crown, or of the efficiency of the police, fire and rescue services or ambulance services

To further these objects, each Lord Mayor selects their nominated charities, and works towards raising funds and awareness. At the end of the Mayoral year, the funds raised are distributed to the nominated charities.

Achievement and Performance

The previous Lord Mayor, Councillor John Hewitt raised a total of £24,150, which was distributed to his nominated charities this year.

Councillor Peter Allen was the Lord Mayor between 25 May 2018 and 23 May 2019. During his year in office, he raised money for his nominated charities which were the Hull Bullnose Heritage Group and Hull Animal Welfare Trust. He also made a donation to the Hull University Teaching Hospital.

During his year in office he held many fundraising events, the main one being the Lord Mayor's Rainbow Ball which was attended by local businesses and members of the LGBT community, Councillors and supporters of the charities. This event supported local entertainers and raised £2,608. The Lord Mayor also hosted many smaller events which were supported by local people and employees of Hull City Council such as quiz nights, golf tournaments and a race evening, raising a further £3,828.

At the end of the financial year, a balance of £19,637 was held which will be distributed to Councillor Allens' nominated charities in the next financial year, once all monies have been collected.

Councillor Steve Wilson became the Lord Mayor on 23 May 2019. His nominated charities are Age UK, Ganton School and Hull Bullnose Heritage Group.

Statement of Trustees Responsibilities

The trustees are responsible for preparing the Report of the Trustees and the financial statements in accordance with applicable law and United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practices.

The law applicable to charities in England & Wales, the Charities Act 2011, Charity (Accounts and Reports) Regulations 2008 and the provisions of the trust deed requires the trustees to prepare financial statements for each financial year which give a true and fair view of the stated of affairs of the charity and of the incoming resources and application of resources, including the income and expenditure, of the charity for that period.

In preparing those financial statements, the trustees are required to:

- select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently;
- observe the methods and principles in the Charity SORP;
- make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent;

- prepare the financial statement on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the charity will continue in business.

The Trustees are responsible for keeping proper accounting records which disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the charity and enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Charities Act 2011, the Charity (Accounts and Reports) Regulations 2008 and the provisions of the trust deed. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the charity and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities

1. Accounting Policies

Basis of accounting

The financial statements have been prepared under the historic cost convention, in accordance with the Accounting and Reporting by Charities - Statement of Recommended Practice (SORP) (FRS102)

Incoming resources

All incoming resources are included on the Statement of Financial Activities when the charity is legally entitled to the income and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy.

Resources expended

Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use or resources.

Funds accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Material Uncertainties

There are no material uncertainties about the charity's ability to continue.
