## **REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES**

#### Name and Status

The name of the charity is Hawes Down Primary School Parent Teacher Association and this is the name under which it operates. The charity was constituted as a charitable incorporated organisation on 6 October 1995 under registration number 1049656.

#### Address

The charity's registered and operational address is The Mead, West Wickham, Kent BR4 0BA.

#### **Trustees**

Throughout the year the trustees were: Matt Defretis, Joanne Patten, Tracy Jenkins, Karen Barlow

#### **Objects**

The purpose of the charity is raise funds for the School.

#### Structure, governance and management

The Trustees are satisfied that the charity works within the objects. The day to day work is undertaken by The Committee members. The Trustees meet regularly to receive reports on and to review the work being undertaken.

#### Financial matters

The Charity's income for the financial period was £26,657 and its expenditure was £18,298.

Income was derived from a combination of income from our charitable activities ( $\pounds$ 21,757), match funding obtained by several parents who work for corporate companies ( $\pounds$ 4,700 from namely Barclays PLC and HSBC) and a donation from the Asda token scheme ( $\pounds$ 200).

The main area of expenditure was carrying out the charitable objects of the company ( $\pounds$ 17,680) of which the largest part was spent on helping fund the music programme ( $\pounds$ 7,500). General expenses of  $\pounds$ 618 (mostly the purchasing of general equipment needed to run the charity) made up the remainder of expenditure.

The PTA released a £10,000 grant to the School in May which had been received from the Big Lottery Big Lottery which was given to enhance Community Cohesion through sport and healthy lifestyle choices.

The Committee decided to wind up the 100 club this financial year.

#### Policies

In view of the nature of the charity and the manner in which it works the Trustees do not consider it necessary to adopt any formal policies at this time.

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### **REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES (cont'd)**

#### Activity from 1 September 2018 to 31 August 2019

The income was raised from a number of events throughout the year, the biggest of which were the Fireworks Night and Summer Fair. Money was raised from events held for the children such as discos, movie nights and Christmas and Easter activities. Regular cake and hot chocolate sales were held, gift/book sales, a bag pack at Sainsburys, a second hand clothing collection, second hand uniform sales, a music quiz, fashion show and bingo night, £1 challenge, smartie challenge, silent auction, foreign coin collection, the cashback website www.easyfundraising.co.uk, Amazon Smile, the Schools Lottery and raffles.

The Charity received donations from the Asda Token Scheme and Match Funding from Barclays and HSBC, in return for their employees helping out at our events.

#### Plans for 2019/20

The same events are planned for next year as listed above except instead of the Summer Fair there will be a Circus and we will not be having a fashion show or gift sales.

The Trustees declare that they have approved the Trustees' report above.
