WorleWind Band became a recognised charity on 10th August 2017. All policies and procedures are reviewed, updated where necessary and reapproved by the Trustees annually.

There were no significant updates to any policies in 2019.

Achievements and performance

Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year

2019 marked 10 years of music making for the band. During the financial year 2019, WorleWind Band activities included 20 Public performances reaching estimated audiences of close to 5000. These performances included: formal concerts, pop up events, bandstand and outdoor performances. The band undertook its first crowd funding event with great success raising over £1k in support of a local family struggling to obtain funds for life-saving medical treatment.

2019 saw perhaps the greatest distances covered within North Somerset and wider South/South West; from Edington to Wareham and Cheltenham, the latter being a playing highlight for us. With repeat bookings for the South Coast and Festive seasons already made for 2020.

The festive season was a busy one reaching further people through some 9 hours of carolling in and around Weston Super Mare and Worle.

Playing membership has remained fairly steady with an active and committed group of musicians totalling 59. With social media interest on facebook and twitter the band has also seen its YouTube views reach the 65,000 mark.

A celebration concert is planned to recognise the 10 years of music making to date and looking forward to the next 10 years.
