7. Aims & Organisation of Charity

The income available to the Charity now exceeds the specific charitable gifts in the late Mr Jobson's Will but the Trustees have a very wide remit to exercise their discretion to apply the income for any charitable purpose. The general tenor of Mr Jobson's Will is to benefit people and children of Horncastle and this, the Trustees endeavour to do but will entertain applications for grants from children who have been educated in Horncastle and who live outside the town. The main charitable giving is to related schools and youth organisations and also grants for students at college. Contributions are also made for the maintenance, upkeep and improvement of local sports complexes and facilities and establishments that house groups and clubs that benefit young people.

There have been no major changes in the aim of the organisation in the last year.

8. Review of Financial Activities and Affairs

- The trust has been able to fund all those applicants who in the trustees' opinion fell within the remit of the charitable objectives and were justified from the income available.
- The trustees monitored the charity income when making grant decisions. The notable grants during April 2018 to April 2019:-

- Further information was requested from some applicants for grants to be assessed again with more detail before pledges were made that fell outside the reporting period.
- The financial advisor attended all trustee meetings during the period providing regular reports and answering queries. The investments were transferred to a new platform where they would be split across 10 funds rather than the existing 3 to increase variety and mitigate risk. This was considered prudent during this period due to the uncertainty in the market being caused by Brexit.

Objectives of the charity

George Jobson's Trust is constituted by a will dated 6 June 1925, and was registered as a charity on 10 December 1962 (Charity No 213875). The income available to the Charity now exceeds the specific charitable gifts in the late Mr Jobson's Will but the Trustees have a very wide remit to exercise their discretion to apply the income for any charitable purpose. The trustees have referred to the guidance contained in the Charity Commission's general guidance on public benefit when reviewing their aims and objectives. The general tenor of Mr Jobson's Will is to benefit people and children of Homcastle and this, the Trustees endeavour to do but will entertain applications for grants from children who have been educated in Horncastle and who live outside the town. The main charitable giving is to related schools and youth organisations and also grants for students at college.

There have been no major changes in the objectives of the charity in the last year.

Activities and achievements this year

The trust has been able to fund all those applicants who the Trustees' opinion fell within the remit of the charitable objectives and were justified from the income available.

The trustees monitored the charity income when making grant decisions. The notable grants during the year were: -

- Banovallum School £3,000 - Horncastle Town Council £5,000

Further pledges were made to match fundraising efforts of applicants.

Financial position and reserves

The charity has reserves of £1,326,911.

Risk management
