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Report of the Trustees for the Year Ended 31 August 2019

The trustees present their report with the financial statements of the charity for the year ended 31 August 2019. The trustees have adopted the provisions of Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2015).

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Objectives and aims

The charity is a charitable incorporated organisation (CIO).

Its objects are:

- to advance the kingdom of God through the inspiring and releasing of all Christian students (and others connected with universities);
- to engage with the prevention and relief of poverty, the advancement of health, the relief of those in need through any disadvantage, the promotion of human rights, harmony and equality, and the advancement of religion, through advocacy, practical action, prayer and partnering with other organisations.

Our vision is to inspire and release every Christian student to pursue the Biblical call to social justice. Our four values describe the way that we work together:

Living like Christ

This value encompasses the centrality of scripture and prayer in all that we do as Just Love. Living Like Christ means displaying grace, integrity and humility in all that we do. We don't live like Christ by our own strength but through God working in us.

Unity and Relationships

We want to make every person involved with Just Love feel extravagantly welcomed, loved and encouraged - and we want to be willing to listen to those we disagree with, to respect their views, and to love them.

Student Ownership

We are obsessed with developing the next generation of Christian leaders, and that can only happen if we give young leaders the freedom to develop. We are committed to putting the support structures in place to enable students involved in Just Love to fulfil their potential and we want as many students as possible to feel a sense of ownership over Just Love.

Quality

This is not about perfectionism, but it is about glorifying God by doing everything we do to the best of our abilities. Quality shows that we care for and respect those whom we work with and those whom we are seeking to serve.

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Significant activities

Just Love started out in Oxford in 2013 with a small group of Christian students who wanted to live out their faith by pursuing the kind of social justice that they were reading about in their Bibles. They wanted other Christian students to do the same and so they began meeting to pray, strategise and send out the first Homeless Outreach groups.

The first Just Love Oxford projects engaged students with issues of homelessness, human trafficking, global poverty and ethical living. Through speaker events, open-mic nights, panel discussions, pub quizzes, prayer meetings, worship evenings, film screenings, Stand For Freedom events and more, Just Love started to gain a name for itself. We saw more and more Christian students getting involved in action, advocacy and prayer for the poor, the marginalised and the oppressed.

Soon a team in Durham was forming with the same heart to see every Christian student in their city committed to social justice and doing something about it.

Just Love groups have since launched around the country, and there are now 22 groups including Bath, Cambridge, Glasgow, Exeter, Norwich, St Andrews, Bristol, London, Sheffield, Manchester, Liverpool, Sussex, Southampton, Edinburgh, Dundee, Cardiff, Nottingham, Birmingham and Leeds. We are hoping to launch new groups in Aberdeen, Newcastle and York before the end of the academic year 2019/20. Further details of Just Love's operations and activities together with its achievements can be found in other sections of the annual report.

As noted above, Just Love runs 22 student groups across England, Scotland and Wales which run projects and events tackling injustice from a Christian perspective. These groups have, over the last 6 years, run 3,500 events with an aggregate attendance of 38,000 students. They have raised £87,000 for other charities and given over 25,000 volunteer hours. Additionally, Just Love runs regional and national training events so that the groups can run effective projects and events. Alongside this, Just Love also runs an alumni network which aims to motivate and equip graduates for a whole-life, life-long pursuit of justice. We do this through running national conferences, career-specific "sphere groups" and numerous other smaller events.

The work of the staff team with our groups takes up 33% of staff time, therefore costing us approximately £45,000 per annum. Additionally, in the 18/19 financial year we budgeted £2,500 to spend on training events and £1,000 to spend on alumni events.

Public benefit

The main activities that the charity has undertaken to further the charity's purposes for the public benefit come through our Just Love groups. The charity supports the groups in running events and projects that engage Christian students in issues of injustice. Additionally, our groups work with local charities and churches in their cities to encourage more Christian students to volunteer and give time and money to various causes in their cities. The alumni network offers support to graduates who are engaging in issues of injustice through their careers. We have set up "sphere groups" in Law, Business, Teaching, Politics, Charity and Church which aim to connect Just Love alumni working in those career areas and equip them to tackle injustice through their line of work. We then bring all of these spheres together for a national conference once a year.

The trustees confirm that they have referred to the guidance contained in the Charity Commission's general guidance on public benefit when reviewing the charity's aims and objectives and in planning future activities.

ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE

Summary of main achievements during the year

In the financial year 2018/19, our Just Love groups ran 958 events with an aggregate attendance of 9,433 students. They raised £28,371 and gave 5,722 volunteer hours.

We also ran our largest ever student training event and alumni networking event.

We successfully raised enough funds to hire two new staff members who started at the end of August 2019.

We completed in-depth strategic reviews of our trustee board and our alumni network. The board review resulted in the hiring of two new trustees who joined the board in the Spring of 2019.

We launched new Just Love Groups in Birmingham, Leeds and Aberdeen.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

Financial position

The trustees have considered the financial position at the balance sheet date and are satisfied that the finances have improved to a satisfactory position. We are working towards having at least 3 months' running costs in the bank, and our cashflow is improving. Going into 2020, the trustees will continue to make improving financial stability a priority for Just Love, through a combination of increasing fundraising opportunities and continuing financial prudence.

Reserves policy

The trustees' reserves policy during the charity's first accounting period was to ensure that sufficient unrestricted funds were held to cover one month's fixed costs. Moving on, the trustees are working towards ensuring unrestricted funds are held sufficient to cover three months' worth of expenditure, including salary costs, amounting to approximately £60,000.

Going concern

The financial statements of the charity have been prepared on a going concern basis as the trustees have assessed the going concern position and have no reason to believe that there are any material uncertainties that would affect the ability of the charity to continue as a going concern for the foreseeable future. The largest expense is staff costs and before making staff appointments, the trustees review year on year cash flow. The trustees have considered the next 12 months and have reviewed post-date reports for that period in making their assessment.

STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

Governing document

The charity is controlled by its governing document, a deed of trust, and constitutes a charitable incorporated organisation (CIO).

Recruitment and appointment of new trustees

In order to recruit and appoint new trustees in 2018/19 we advertised widely and accepted CVs and covering letters from potential candidates. Successful candidates were interviewed by the trustees and met with three senior members of staff. The trustees then made a decision, taking in to account the opinions of the senior staff members. New trustees were then inducted by the chair and national coordinator and joined the trustee board at the next meeting.

Decision making

Day-to-day management is delegated to the National Coordinator.

Key management personnel

Key Management Personnel (KMPs) are deemed to be the Senior Leadership Team. Roles included in this team are the National Coordinator, the Northern Coordinator, the Operations Director and the Scotland Coordinator. Remuneration of our KMPs is disclosed in note 10.

Notes to the Financial Statements for the Year Ended 31 August 2019

ACCOUNTING POLICIES 1.

Basis of preparing the financial statements

The financial statements of the charity, which is a public benefit entity under FRS 102, have been prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102) 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2015)', Financial Reporting Standard 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland' and the Charities Act 2011. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

The financial statement are prepared in sterling, which is the functional currency of the charity, and rounded to the nearest £.

The significant accounting policies applied in the preparation of these financial statements are set out below. These policies have been consistently applied to all years presented unless otherwise stated.

Financial reporting standard 102 - reduced disclosure exemptions

The charity has taken advantage of the following disclosure exemption in preparing these financial statements, as permitted by FRS 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland':

the requirements of Section 7 Statement of Cash Flows.

All income is recognised in the Statement of Financial Activities once the charity has entitlement to the funds, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably.

For donations to be recognised, if not received before the year end, the charity will have been notified of the amounts and settlement date in writing.

Services donated to the charity are recognised as income when the criteria for their recognition is met. These criteria are entitlement (when the charity is entitled to the donation, i.e. the service has been performed), probability (the charity will in all likelihood receive the donated service) and measurement (the service or services can be given a fair value).

For grants to be recognised, if not received before the year end, the charity will have been notified of its entitlement, the amounts due and the settlement date in writing. Certain grants may contain terms or conditions that must be met before the charity has entitlement to the funds and these grants would only be recognised once those conditions were met.

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES - continued

Expenditure

Liabilities are recognised as expenditure as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to that expenditure, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefits will be required in settlement and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably. Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

All expenditure is recognised inclusive of VAT, where VAT applies.

Costs which are directly attributable to the charitable activities of the company are allocated accordingly. Costs which are 'mixed' in nature, such as staff costs, advertising, governance are allocated using a pre-determined percentage of 90% charitable activities and 10% raising funds. This percentage is reviewed annually and for 2019, staff development and travel costs have been varied to what is considered to be a more appropriate basis of 95% charitable activities and 5% raising funds.

Grants offered subject to conditions which have not been met at the year end date are noted as a commitment but not accrued as expenditure.

Taxation

The charity is exempt from tax on its charitable activities.

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statements.

Leasing commitments

Leases in which a significant portion of the risks and rewards of ownership are retained by the lessor are classified as operating leases. Payments made under operating leases are recognised in the income statement on a straight line basis over the term of the lease.

Pension costs and other post-retirement benefits

The charity operates a defined contribution pension scheme. Contributions payable to the charity's pension scheme are charged to the Statement of Financial Activities in the period to which they relate.

Going concern

The financial statements of the charity have been prepared on a going concern basis as the trustees have assessed the going concern position and have no reason to believe that there are material uncertainties that would affect the ability of the charity to continue as a going concern for the foreseeable future. The trustees have considered the next 12 months and have reviewed reports for that period in making their assessment.

Debtors and creditors receivable/payable within one year

Debtors and creditors with no stated interest rate and receivable or payable within one year are recorded at transaction price. Any losses arising from impairment are recognised in expenditure.

Employee benefits

When employees have rendered service to the charity, short-term employee benefits to which the employees are entitled are recognised at the undiscounted amount expected to be paid in exchange for that service.

Cash and cash equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents include cash in hand and cash deposits with financial institutions that are readily convertible to known amounts of cash with insignificant risk of change in value.
