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Report of the Trustees for the Year Ended 30 June 2019

The trustees who are also directors of the charity for the purposes of the Companies Act 2006, present their report with the financial statements of the charity for the year ended 30 June 2019. The trustees have adopted the provisions of Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2015).

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Principal Activity

The principal activity of the company is the operation of a charity shop and management of a community social centre to improve communications in the area of West Howe and make it a better place to live. To improve the quality of life for people in West Howe through creating opportunities for them to give, connect with each other, be active, learn something new and be confident in themselves and the wider community.

Public benefit

The trustees have had regard to the Charity Commission guidance on public benefit.

Report of the Trustees for the Year Ended 30 June 2019

ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE

Achievement

West Howe Community Enterprises was set up in 2009 by residents from the local area. West Howe is a large area of social housing predominately made up of social housing which endures high levels of deprivation. Many of the residents here may not enjoy the opportunities commonplace in other areas.

We are both a Non Profit Company limited by Guarantee and a Registered Charity with the following aims:

Object 1 - Urban or Rural Regeneration:

The promotion for the benefit of the public of urban or rural regeneration in areas of social and economic deprivation (and in particular in West Howe, Bournemouth) by all or any of the following means:

(a) the relief of financial hardship

(b) the relief of unemployment

- (c) the advancement of education, training or retraining, particularly among unemployed people, and providing unemployed people with work experience
- (d) the provision of financial assistance, technical assistance or business advice or consultancy in order to provide training and employment opportunities for unemployed people in cases of financial or other charitable need through help: (i) in setting up their own business, or (ii) to existing businesses
- (e) the creation of training and employment opportunities by the provision of workspace, buildings, and/or land for use on favourable terms

(g) the maintenance, improvement or provision of public amenities

- (i) the provision of recreational facilities for the public at large or those who by reason of their youth, age, infirmity or disablement, financial hardship or social and economic circumstances, have need of such facilities
- (j) the protection or conservation of the environment
- (k) the provision of public health facilities and childcare

(l) the promotion of public safety and prevention of crime

(m) such other means as may from time to time be determined subject to the prior written consent of the Charity Commissioners for England and Wales."

Object 2 - Community capacity building

To develop the capacity and skills of the members of the socially or socially and economically disadvantaged community of West Howe in such a way that they are better able to identify, and help meet, their needs and to participate more fully in society.

Object 3 - Social Inclusion

To promote social inclusion for the public benefit by preventing people from becoming socially excluded, relieving the needs of those people who are socially excluded and assisting them to integrate into society. Being excluded from society, or part of society, as a result of being a member of a socially and economically deprived community.

Object 4 - Recycling

a) The protection and preservation of the environment for the public benefit by the promotion of waste reduction, re-use, reclamation, recycling, use of recycled products and the use of surplus;

b) The relief of financial hardship by the recycling and provision of furniture, clothes and other household items.

ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE

Annual review

2018-2019 has seen us securing further support and developing new partnerships to enable us to upscale and expand the charity.

Thanks to Tudor Trust funding and to the Henry Smith charity granting us strengthening communities funding, we have been able to increase the charity managers post to full time to help us move closer to our vision of establishing the Henry Brown Centre as a community wide centre alongside residents. We continue to work towards creating a robust, sustainable charity with residents. Trustees have allocated £10,000 to hold in reserves this coming year.

We have secured a partnership agreement with Bournemouth Early Help to extend West Howe Community Enterprises operations from the Henry Brown Centre. We now have an additional base within the building and run the day to day management of the centre, continuing to further develop existing projects, extend participation and the range of opportunities and activities available from the venue for the residents of West Howe.

This year has seen WHCE lose the valued posts of volunteer and activities coordinator which has impacted on engagement figures however funding from Dorset Community Foundation has contributed towards our café cook post and we have further developed the wellbeing café, extending opening hours. We continue to coordinate the activity programme and we are at present seeking external funding with the aim to recruit an activities coordinator, volunteer and development officer as soon as financially viable for the charity. This year has seen us strengthen and build new partnerships to continue to run the health and wellbeing programme and extend activities available within the centre. We have received funding support from Sovereign Housing and our strengthening partnership with Skills and learning has enabled the programme to continue. We have coordinated entry level learning with courses in subjects such as ESOL, cookery, family arts, cookery and sewing. This enables residents to try something new, make new friends and acted as an introduction to learning. All the sessions have allowed us to provide training, workshops and our family learning locally giving local people of all ages a chance to try new things, build their confidence and skills and improve overall wellbeing. The café has also become a base for independent community groups to meet such as a local men's shed project and the West Howe Writers. We value the wellbeing of residents and through our service level agreement with North Bournemouth Locality we facilitate a peer diabetic support group to run from the centre monthly.

This year has bought us closer to our vision of a connected community where needed services, activities and support are available locally. We have enabled the Henry Brown centre to be available more for the local community and look forward to continuing to maximise use of this community asset in the future.

This year we have recruited a full-time charity shop manager. The Inspiring Change shop continues to offer volunteering opportunities and a place where local residents can find out about all our activities through the volunteers, who run, with support from the shop manager, the day to day opening of the shop.

We have enjoyed engagement from 372 residents of all ages who have attended our projects. In total there are currently 16 volunteers supporting us across all the projects. Existing projects such as the café, charity shop, bingo and give and take continue to be delivered with the support of volunteers. Volunteers have undertaken training in subjects such as first aid, food hygiene, fire training, enterprise, regularly meet and have formed a fundraising group to contribute. We continue to embed a respecting ethos and grassroots bottom up approach ensuring communities have a voice and can contribute in shaping their community. Volunteers alongside residents continue to contribute to the planning of projects and events while valuing each other's contributions. We enjoyed a successful AGM and continue to encourage local driven membership.

We continue to run the website www.westhowe.net and have aspiration to increase awareness and participation in grassroots media to ensure residents have a voice which showcases good examples of citizen journalism.

ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE Annual review

Company law requires the directors to prepare financial statements for each financial year. Under the law the directors have elected to prepare the financial statements in accordance with United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice (United Kingdom Accounting Standards and applicable law). Under company law the directors must not approve the financial statements unless they are satisfied that they give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the company and of the profit or loss of the company for that period. In preparing these financial statements, the directors are required to:

- select suitable accounting policies and apply them consistently;
- make judgements and accounting estimates that are reasonable and prudent; and
- prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the company will continue in business.

The directors are responsible for keeping adequate accounting records that are sufficient to show and explain the company's transactions and disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the company and enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Companies Act 2006. They are also responsible for safeguarding these assets of the company and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

Financial Position

Total income for the year has increased to £139,021 (2018 - £75,778) and the total expenditure for the year was £76,235 (2018 - £73,601) allowing the charity to make a surplus of £62,786 (2018 - £2,177). This has resulted in unrestricted funds of £48,532 (2018 - £45,155) and restricted funds of £81,757 (2018 - £23,602) at the year end.

Reserves policy

The Trustees aim to maintain £10,000 of unrestricted funds as a reserve to cover expenditure.

STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

Governing document

The charity is controlled by its governing document, a deed of trust, and constitutes a limited company, limited by guarantee, as defined by the Companies Act 2006.

Recruitment and appointment of new trustees

New trustees will be appointed by the existing trustees. The induction process will involve the new trustees receiving a copy of our governing deed and a copy of The Charity Commissions Guidance "The Essential Trustee - What you need to know" and "Charities and Public Benefit".

LEGAL FORM

West Howe Community Enterprises is a private charitable company, that is limited by guarantee and is incorporated in England and Wales. The registered office is noted on the company information page.

2. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of preparing the financial statements

The financial statements of the charitable company, which is a public benefit entity under FRS 102, have been prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102) 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2015)', Financial Reporting Standard 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland' and the Companies Act 2006. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

Income

All income is recognised in the Statement of Financial Activities once the charity has entitlement to the funds, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably.

Expenditure

Liabilities are recognised as expenditure as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to that expenditure, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefits will be required in settlement and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably. Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

Charitable activities

Charitable expenditure comprises those costs incurred by the Charity in the delivery of its activities and services for its beneficiaries. It includes both costs that can be allocated directly to such activities and those costs of an indirect nature necessary to support them.

Governance costs

These include the cost attributable to the Charity's compliance with constitutional and statutory requirements, including audit, strategic management and Trustee's meetings and reimbursed expenses.

Irrecoverable VAT

Irrecoverable VAT is charged against the category of resources expended for which it was incurred.

Tangible fixed assets

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life.

Computer equipment

- 20% on cost

Taxation

The charity is exempt from corporation tax on its charitable activities.

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statements.

2. ACCOUNTING POLICIES - continued

Pension costs and other post-retirement benefits

The charitable company operates a defined contribution pension scheme. Contributions payable to the charitable company's pension scheme are charged to the Statement of Financial Activities in the period to which they relate.

Cash and cash equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents comprise cash on hand and call deposits, and other short-term highly liquid investments that are readily convertible to a know amount of and are subject to an insignificant risk of change in value.

Trade creditors

Trade creditors are obligations to pay for goods or services that have ben acquired in the ordinary course of business from suppliers. Accounts payable are classified as current liabilities if the Charity does not have an unconditional right, at the end of the reporting period, to defer settlement of the creditor for at least twelve months after the reporting date, they are presented as non-current liabilities.

Trade creditors are recognised initially at the transaction price and subsequently measured at amortised cost using the effective interest method.

Debtors

Trade debtors are recognised at the settlement amount due after any trade discount offered.

Prepayments are valued at the amount prepaid net of any trade discounts due.

BBC Skills fund is part of the West Howe Regeneration Partnership agreement.

Lif Fund is to be used for general Charity overheads and running costs.

Activate Dorset is a fund used to engage the community in living an active lifestyle.

Wheelie Inspired Project is restricted for the community bike scheme.

Sovereign Housing - Local initiative to support entry courses to improve skills and increase independence in the West Howe area.

Wellbeing Cafe - to cover staffing costs for the Wellbeing Cafe.

Literature Works - to cover funding for Creative Writing workshops.

Big Lottery - Awards for All funding for support with running costs for the Inspiring Change shop.

Henry Smith - Funding restricted for running costs, activities and learning opportunities provided by the Henry Brown wellbeing cafe. The grant is a 3 year grant with the full amount to be received recognised as grant income in the reporting year. A balance of £68,000 is held in other debtors at the year end to be received over the next 2 years.

The following funds have a nil balance remaining at the year end. The purposes for these funds are given below as information for the comparative year:

Peoples Health Trust was for the continuation of the 'Growing Inspiration Project'.

Greggs Bakers fund was to engage the community through the spirit of cooking, and to help with self confidence.

Health Champions fund was used to deliver peer led support, information and opportunities around Health and Wellbeing.

BBC Wellbeing fund was for the 'Mental Health Wellbeing Project'.
