## Trustees' Annual Report For the year ended 30th June 2019

St Albans City Youth Football Club (the Club) is a registered charity with registration number 1089343. The charity was established as an Association by a Constitution dated 4<sup>th</sup> November 2001.

#### **Objectives**

The Clubs objectives are:

- 1. To organise or provide or assist in the organisation or provision of facilities which will enable boys and girls up to the age of 18 years of age (for disability groups 25 years) resident in St Albans and the surrounding area ("the area of benefit") to play football and organised sport ensuring that due attention is given to the physical, personal and educational development of such boys and girls and to the development and occupation of their minds.
- 2. To further other charitable purposes, particularly in the area of benefit, as the Executive Committee of the Charity may from time to time decide.

#### Achievements and performance

The Club has been providing youth football in St Albans since 1971 and for season 2018/19 has over 950 players registered in over 80 teams in the age range of 7 - 18 years. The Club continues to provide coaching for approximately 150 boys and girls aged 9 and under on Saturdays throughout the football season.

The clubs Disability Sports Section (aimed at 12 to 25 year olds) continues to thrive with four teams playing at various levels during the season. Players older than 25 are able to join or remain with the group providing they contribute by helping the younger members.



The Club continues to run a number of holiday, after school and weekend activities for the area in partnership with other sports organisations e.g. Herts Sports Partnership, Active St Albans and local Schools. In addition we have carried out a number of community projects in partnership with St Albans City FC as part of the National League Trust project. Our Sports Facilities are also offered to other Community Sports Groups.

We offer Player Development Centres, Futsal and Goalkeeper Tutorials for boys and girls who want additional training from more experienced coaches.

The Club has been encouraged to develop its Community Sports activities following the achievement of the highest accreditation from Hertfordshire FA. The club employs young coaches on a part time basis to help manage the Community aspects of the Club and to help improve the standard of coaching generally. We have a business manager overseeing the general running of the club, and in the future will have a full time football development officer. We also continue to offer coaching opportunities for the 2 keenest members of our Disability Sports Group.

The Club's numerous footballing achievements and awards can be viewed on their website <u>www.cityyouthfc.com</u> which also gives a wealth of other information concerning the Club Structure, Constitution, Ethos and detailed Community Club Development Plan.

The Club has a 25 year licence to use land on Highfield Lane St Albans as football pitches and to use the Community Pavilion facilities as changing rooms (11 pitches). The club continues to invest in the maintenance of the pitches with various groundworks being carried out during the summer months.

The Trustees under the stewardship of Mervyn Morgan implemented a project to provide a high specification All Weather Football Pitch for the Club at Nicholas Breakspear School. The Club has an agreement to use the all-weather training facilities for 25 years from June 2012 for "out of school" hours of use. This season, through appeal, we have won the right to extend the hours use of the training pitch should we wish to use them.

In partnership with Samuel Ryder Academy the Club have created a Futsal Centre and Grass Pitches for matches for St Albans City Youth teams. Our trained coaches run the Futsal sessions for the St Albans teams. In addition, we are also pleased to announce that a second All Weather Football Pitch will be available to the club thanks to a partnership with Samuel Ryder Academy. The facility has been a roaring success, and we look for this to continue into the future, on the 25 year licence we have.

Finally, the Trustees and Team Managers have continued to be extremely successful in increasing the number of sponsors and maintaining grant monies that have helped the Charity to achieve its success. This funding has enabled The Club to continue to grow as well as being able to offer a better range of services to the local community at the lowest possible cost to players and parents.



The Charitable status and in particular the Gift Aid funding has allowed Managers to nominate/help individuals for free or subsidised membership. The Committee of the Club has been able to support every single nomination that has been put forward.

During the year, Alan Moorhouse, pivotal in us acquiring our two all-weather facilities and acquiring our extended hours licence at Nicholas Breakspear stood down as a Trustee, and as a club we thank him for his service. Alan has been appointed a Vice President of the club in recognition of his outstanding contribution.

Alas, this is my first, yet last report as a Chair of Trustees as I will be standing down, returning to my previous role as a trustee - though happy to be serving in the interim until a replacement can be found. I would like to thank everyone for their support, especially Robert Baker, the Club Treasurer, for all of his hard work over the past year.

#### Financial review

The Club has adopted the Charities Statement of Recommended Practice 2005.

The Clubs financial activities are summarised in the attached financial statements.

As at 30<sup>th</sup> June 2019 the accounts show a loss for the financial year of £11,035. This figure is after allowing for depreciation of the club assets and including the further investment in Highfield Park. The Total Charity Fund stands at £309,164.

Grant funding is continuing in the current economic climate to be difficult to obtain so a modest increase in fees has been put in place this year.

Gift Aid continues to enable us to help a number of good causes and youth education within the St Albans District.

## NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30th JUNE 2019

#### 1) Basis of preparation

a) Basis of accounting

These accounts have been prepared on the basis of historic cost in accordance with:

- Accounting and Reporting by Charities Statement of Recommended Practice (SORP 2005);
- And with Accounting Standards;
- And with the Charities Act.

The accruals basis has been adopted in the preparation of these accounts.

There has been no change to the accounting policies (valuation rules and methods of accounting) since last year.

No changes have been made to accounts for previous years.

#### 2) Accounting Policies

- a) Incoming Resources
  - i. Recognition of incoming resources
    These are included in the Statement of Financial Activities (SoFA)
    when:
    - the charity becomes entitled to the resources;
    - the trustees are virtually certain they will receive the resources;
    - and the monetary value can be measured with sufficient reliability.
  - ii. Incoming resources with related expenditure
    Where incoming resources have related expenditure the incoming
    resources and related expenditure are reported gross in the SoFA.
  - iii. Grants and donations
    Grants and donations are only included in the SoFA when the charity has unconditional entitlement to the resources.
  - iv. Tax reclaims on donations and gifts
    Incoming resources from tax reclaims are included in the SoFA at
    the same time as the gift to which they relate and when the trustee
    are virtually certain they will receive the resources
  - v. Investment income
    This is included in the accounts when receivable.

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## NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS (continued) FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30th JUNE 2019

#### 2 Accounting Policies (continued)

- b) Expenditure and Liabilities
  - Liability recognition
     Liabilities are recognised as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to pay out resources and the charity becomes entitled to the resources;
  - ii. Grants with performance conditions

    Where the charity gives a grant with conditions for its payment being a specific level of service or output to be provided, such grants are only recognised in the SoFA once the recipient of the grant has provided the specified service or output.
  - iii. Grants payable without performance conditions

    These are only recognised in the accounts when a commitment has been made and there are no conditions to be met relating to the grant which remain in the control of the charity.

#### c) Assets

i. Licences

These are capitalised if they can be used for more than one year and cost at least £1,000. They are valued at cost or a reasonable value on receipt. Licenses are amortised over the useful life.

ii. Stocks

Stock is valued at the lower of cost or net realisable value. The Club maintains a pool of football kit and stocks, which is reviewed annually. Any material change in the cost or net realisable value is accounted for in the Profit and Loss account.

#### 14. Capital commitments and contingent liabilities

In 2016 the Trustees signed a new licence with Highfield Park Trust to use football pitches and changing rooms at Highfield Park until 2040. This has enabled us to combine and renew the 2 existing Licences. In recent years the Club has subsequently made a further investments of £16,000 to improve the car parking and track leading to the pavilion on the back field. In addition, the club also funded £24,000 towards pitch renovation works to help with drainage on the new field.

The Trustees signed a licence with Nicholas Breakspear School in May 2012 to use the AWP training facilities until May 2037. The Club made a non-returnable payment of £26,000 from Club funds. In addition the Club secured another non-returnable funding of £84,000 from St Albans District Council, this funding went direct to Nicholas Breakspear School to help pay for the AWP Facility. This total investment has been reflected in the valuation with priority use provided to The Club for 25 years. There was further Football Foundation Funding of £306,000 invested into this project.

The Trustees signed a licence with Samuel Ryder Academy in August 2018 to use the AWP training facilities until August 2043. This required an investment by the club of £45,000. There was further Football Foundation funding of £440,000 invested into this project.
