## BRAMHALL AND WYTHENSHAWE Circuit TRUSTEES' ANNUAL REPORT

#### FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 AUGUST 2019

#### Introduction

The circuit is part of the wider Methodist church and comprises 12 churches across the border between Greater Manchester and Cheshire. The circuit was formed in 2012 by the merging of the former Bramhall and Wythenshawe circuits. Whilst this report concentrates on the financial aspects of the circuit's work, a fuller picture can be obtained by visiting the circuit website:

#### Aims and organisation

#### Review of the year

The financial position this year has been complicated by the sale of the Handforth manse. This was completed in this year. A new manse in the Wythenshawe section of the circuit was purchased in 2017/18 using a bridging loan from Chapel Aid. The sale of the Handforth manse enabled the bridging loan to be repaid. There was a surplus from the sale which had been anticipated. Part of that surplus was used to refurbish the manses in Northenden and Heald Green which had become vacant as the ministers had left the circuit. Those 2 manses were subsequently let and are bringing in a rental income. The remainder of the surplus from the sale has been added to the circuit reserves. The trustees will decide on the use of that surplus. The normal operations of the circuit during the year resulted in a surplus of income over expenditure of £13k. The budget for the year had predicted a very small deficit. The major reasons for this are: a) Less expenditure on the routine maintenance of the manses than forecast. b) Reduced expenditure on circuit lay staff because of a delayed appointment.

#### **Income trends**

Feedback from the churches indicates that most of them are beginning to see a fall in income because of reduced giving which comes from a fall in membership.

The circuit leadership team recognise that this will, in some cases, reduce their ability to meet their circuit assessment thus reducing the income of the circuit. Plans are being made to secure the long term future of the circuit.

#### **Expenditure trends**

Stipend expenditure has increased each financial year in line with conference approved increases. Lay salaries are increased in line with stipends except where the funding church cannot afford to.

20% of expenditure is the Circuit contribution to the District annd Connexion, of which a significant part is used to fund the work of the wider Methodist Church.

#### **Fund balances**

As at 31 August 2019 the net current unrestricted assets of the Circuit were £152k, giving approximately 4.5 months cover for budgeted expenditure.

#### Plans for 2019/20

Circuit financial plans for the coming year were prepared on the basis that the staffing levels of 5 full time ordained staff and 3 lay staff remains the same with the lay staff contributing an average of 30 hours per week each. The approved stipend and lay salary increases of 2.8% have been budgeted for, combined with a 5% increase in council tax and utilities costs. The district assessment has risen by 4.8%.

Churches were requested to provide a 2% increase in their assessment but some churches indicated that this would not be possible. The budgeted income reflects the agreed shortfall. An anticipated increase in rental income from the 2 manses that are now let will offset some of the shortfall from the churches

#### **Risk Management**

The major risks have been identified and recorded by the Circuit Stewards with professional advice taken as required.

#### Safeguarding

Every person has a value and dignity which comes directly from the creation of male and female in God's own image and likeness. Christians see this potential as fulfilled by God's re-creation of us in Christ. Among other things this implies a duty to value all people as bearing the image of God and therefore to protect them from harm.

Methodist Connexional practice outlines commitment to the following principles:

- the care and nurture of, and respectful pastoral ministry with, all children, young people and adults
- the safeguarding and protection of all children, young people and adults when they are vulnerable
- the establishing of safe, caring communities which provide a loving environment where there is informed vigilance as to the dangers of abuse.
- We will carefully select and train all those with any responsibility within the Church, in line with Safer Recruitment principles, including the use of criminal records disclosures and registration with the relevant vetting and barring schemes.

#### **Reserves Policy**

The Reserves Policy for the Circuit is to hold a minimum sum equivalent to 2 months' average expenditure. This should be sufficient to meet any unforeseen item of major expenditure on manses and / or to be able to continue, in the short term, funding planned activities in the event of any inability to raise the full Circuit Assessment from churches.

#### Notes to the Accounts

#### 1 Basis of accounting

The financial statements have been prepared under the Charities Act 2011 in accordance with the 2014 version of Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice (SORP) applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with FRS102 – the Charities SORP (FRS102) and taking note of the Update Bulletin 1 issued in 2016.

#### 2 Funds

The funds held constitute: General Funds held for any purpose of the Circuit which are Unrestricted. The Circuit Model Trust Fund has wide purposes defined in Standing Orders and is categorised as unrestricted. Designated funds are where funds have been allocated for a specific purpose but are categorised as unrestricted so their use can be changed. Restricted funds which are held for a narrower purpose. There are also the following Endowment funds as listed. Details of each material fund are disclosed in the final note to these accounts. Any funds may be represented by more than just cash.

#### 3 Accounting policies

#### **Basis**

These accounts have been prepared on the basis of historical cost except that investments are shown at their market value at the end of the year, on the accruals basis to show a true and fair view of the Circuit's financial position and activities.

#### **Income Recognition**

Income is included in the Statement of Financial Activities (SOFA) when the Circuit becomes entitled to the resources, and the trustees are reasonably certain they will receive the resources; and the monetary value can be measured with sufficient reliability.

#### **Resources Expended**

This is recognised when a liability is incurred, or a constructive obligation arises, that results in the payment being unavoidable. Liabilities are recognised as soon as an outflow of economic benefit is considered more likely than not under the legal or constructive obligation committing the Circuit to pay out resources.

#### Grants

Grants made by the Circuit from its own funds are recognised in full at the time of agreement or when the Circuit accepts that there is a legal or operational obligation to make the payment. When the grant is recurrent over more than one year the balance payable in future years is treated as a provision for future commitments in the Balance Sheet against the appropriate fund, the provision being released in future years as instalments are paid in accordance with the originally agreed terms.

#### VAT

Since the Circuit is not VAT registered, all input VAT is charged with the expenses to which it refers.

#### Tangible fixed assets for use by the Circuit

These are capitalised if they can be used for more than one year, and individually cost at least £1,000.

#### **Investment Properties**

Investment properties - no property is currently deemed to not be held for the long term purposes of the charity.

#### Investments

Investments are valued in the balance sheet at market value at the year end. Investment income is included in the accounts when receivable and any gains or losses on revaluation at the year end are shown in the SOFA.

#### **Debtors and Prepayments**

The major Debtors items relate to the payment of the September stipend in August and 12 months manse insurance paid in advance.

#### **Creditors**

Creditors items relate to the audit fee and for money to be paid for a training course for Rev. Katy Thomas, agreed in 2018/19 but which was not taken before the year end. (Part of that money relates to a grant towards the training from the District which has been received by the circuit)

#### 12 Investments

Trust property is held for and on behalf of local Managing Trustees who are responsible for the day to day management of trust property. TMCP ensure that, through providing guidance and acting under their direction, the Managing Trustees comply with charity law and Methodist law and polity as determined by the Methodist Conference.
