Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year

Achievements and performance

An innovative and inspiring new approach to the years events.

We re-categorised the Vedic programs to Sat Sang, Special Events and Festivals. We addressed the desires of the community to honour the special Vedic Vaisnava festivals according to their popularity. We then facilitated by arranging the programs in one of the categories depending on their attendance, i.e. a popular festival like Janmastami came in the category of festival and we hired a hall to facilitate that attendance.

We changed the name of the Vedic discussion, to Sunday Sat Sang. We found this to be more catchy and in trend at the moment in yoga circles and alternative groups. We noticed that during the year we had an increase in the Sat Sang attendance and similarly in the Special Events and Festivals. The popularity of the Vedic philosophy and spirituality has become a main part of our activities. In due respect to this we decided to add "religious activity" to the charity classifications.

The Friday night meditation and Kirtan night has developed into an exciting "Friday Night Experience". Every Friday there is a different event or program/workshop, namely spiritual poetry, arcana workshop, japa meditation, cooking workshop, Kirtan, guided meditation and Jaiva dharma workshop.

This proves to keep a lively interest from the community and a regular attendance of people who come, knowing something will be happening. We give refreshments and a light meal.

This year yoga has had a lot more regular attendance. We also had enquiries for a week day program which we decided to do every Tuesday.

The children's program was originally an idea to engage the children in learning and participating in the Sunday Sat Sang program. This had good results at first but the children became more unruly as other children joined the group. It proved to become a difficult situation to control them and we soon realised that we needed a trained teacher and more of a regulated structure to engage them. Some of the children were older and need facilitating for in a different way. There has been a proposal to engage the children in a workshop style, art based, educational course. The workshops will carry the theme of the timeless teachings of the Ramayana. We have been encouraging for this. There is definitely a requirement at the centre for this. The project proposed by a member of our community is being very nicely researched and formulated. She is looking at a running time of 7 months with different activities relating to the topic. She will use drama, art, writing etc. to convey the children's concepts, being high lighted. Then they will present it to the Sunday Sat sang group. The "Food for All" program has given a feel good factor in the community and also for everyone involved. It began as a program to promote healthy living and vegetarianism and it has naturally evolved with our own awareness into a spiritual sharing of prasad (spiritually sanctified food stuffs) and to promote an increase into awareness about our body and the environment. Everyone is happy to keep this as a regular event in the calendar.

Regarding the Indian retreat project. After thorough investigation into building temporary structures as a way to use the land in India for our purpose of a retreat centre, it was decided upon that this was not a practical option. The severe weather conditions and lack of suitable plumbing for waste water and sewage etc. caused us to re-think. Eventually we were able to retrieve the original contribution for the development by donating the land to a known charity in the area and accepting a cash donation from them in return. The subsequent funds were deposited into the Gangamatas account in December 2019.

The 5 day 'Gurudeva Tirobhav Festival ' was held in December 2019. Planning and arrangement for the festival was excellent. All needs and requirements were graciously provided for by the staff and volunteers and it was a massive success. This was the first time that we hired a centre with a hall, kitchen facility and accommodation for up to 75 people. The charity provided meals 3 x a day workshops, class, arati's, kirtan, etc.. People were inspired to such an extent it was spoken about by many of the attendees to have a similar place to hold regular programs and events. It proved there was a big necessity for the whole community to get together for events such as this. It strengthened peoples sense of family and community, relationships and responsibility. It was a good introduction for us in a practical sense to appreciate what facilities we would need for a future project like this and also to inspire the community to give on a regular basis to help financially for this. We look forward to researching the possibilities of having a retreat centre in the UK.

All in all we have observed a natural growth in all areas from different programs and projects to an increase in attendants and subsequently a need for an extra staff member. We are also taking into account the increase in desire for programs more inline with the Vedic teachings and pure spiritual philosophy.
