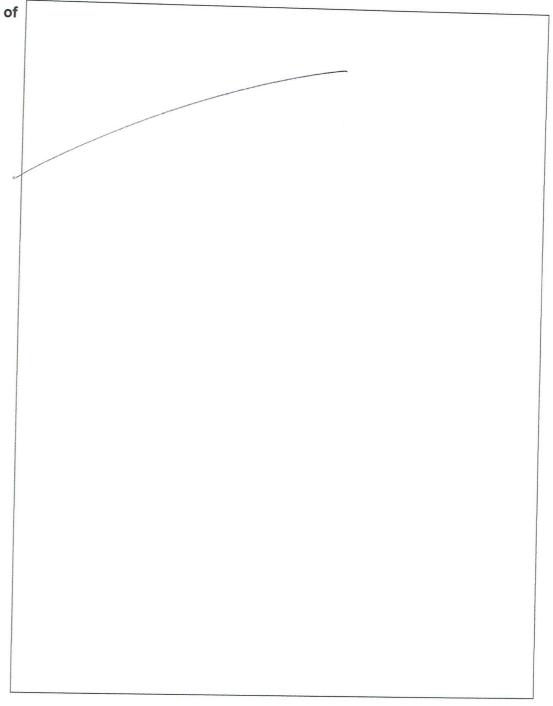

REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 JUNE 2019

GOVERNING DOCUMENT & CHARITABLE OBJECTIVES

The Charity is governed by its Constitution which was adopted on 07 January 2008.

We are affiliated to the Middlesex County Football Association and our Club adheres to all of the relevant policies and guidelines of the Football Association in respect of safeguarding of young persons and vulnerable adults.

Our main charitable objective is to advance the education of young people up to the age of 18 by providing opportunities and facilities for playing football in order to develop their physical, mental and spiritual capacities so that they may grow to full maturity as individuals and members of society and that their conditions of life may be improved.

The Trustees are pleased to present their Annual Report together with the Financial Statements for the year ended 30 June 2019.

RISK MANAGEMENT

The Management Committee actively reviews the major risks which the Charity faces on a regular basis and believes that maintaining reserves at current levels, combined with an annual review of the controls over key financial systems, will provide sufficient resources in the event of unforeseen circumstances. The management have also examined other operational and business risks faced by the Charity and confirm that they have established procedures to mitigate the significant risks.

REPORT ON ACTIVITIES

The Charity was established in order to organise and provide or to assist with the organisation of facilities which will enable young persons up to the age of 18 who are resident in the London Borough of Barnet and surrounding areas to enjoy footballing activities. The Charity will endeavour to ensure that due attention is given to the physical, personal and educational development of these boys and girls.

We have continued to keep our membership fees at a reasonable level and we assisted many families who would not otherwise have been able to afford for their children to play football. As a

registered charity set up for the public benefit our charges are approximately one third of the fees which are charged by commercial organisations in the local area. Furthermore we offered discounts to families with more than one young person playing for our Club and we also provided substantial fee reductions and payment plans to families on low income.

In the year under review we operated 40 teams at different ages and ability levels. We continue to support girls football and girls are encouraged to play mixed football in the younger age groups until they reach an age where we can run a team in the Capital Girls' League for them.

We also offer free membership to young adults with learning difficulties and we are pleased to note how much they enjoy playing for our Unified team in the Middlesex Pan Disability League.

COMMUNITY CLUB STATUS

In view of our long record of achievement and stability we were awarded Charter Standard Community Club status by the Middlesex Football Association in January 2012. Only a very small number of Clubs are able to meet the stringent criteria laid down by the Football Association and we are pleased to report that our Community Club status was renewed following our Annual Review. We are encouraging all of our Coaches to join the Football Association Licensed Coaches Club and to obtain the various FA Youth Coaching Awards.

All of Coaches have passed or are in the process of obtaining the Level One Coaching qualification and we have several Level Two Coaches who work with our players on a regular basis. One of Coaches who works with an Under 15 team has been accepted as a Level 3 candidate and he is working towards the Full 'B' Licence awarded by UEFA which is the highest level of qualification outside of the professional game and is recognised throughout Europe. We also have specialist goalkeeper coaches who work with our young keepers in developing their technique.

Everyone who works with our young people is subject to an Enhanced Level CRB check and they hold Emergency Aid qualifications and attend Safeguarding Children Workshops as required.

Our coaches and team managers work on a voluntary basis and the Trustees are very grateful for the skill, dedication and commitment from everyone involved with our Club.

PLAYING RESULTS

The playing results were reasonable with many trophies being won. We always encourage fair play and sporting behaviour from all Players, Coaches and Parents who represents our Club.

We hosted our 17th Annual Summer Sixes tournament in June 2019. The weather was extremely fine and everyone had a great time. The season finished with the Club's Presentation Day Ceremony where each player is presented with an award for playing for the Club and the successful teams are presented with their trophies.

FINANCIAL PERFORMANCE

The Charity made a small surplus in the year ended 30 June 2019.

The Trustees consider that the Charity has sufficient cash reserves to meet its projected expenditure and that the overall financial situation is satisfactory.

FUTURE DEVELOPMENTS & PARTNERSHIPS

Our partnership with Cockfosters FC has enabled some of our senior teams to play at a higher level in the Eastern Junior Alliance and results so far this season have been encouraging. It is pleasing to note that a number of our players have appeared for the Cockfosters U 18 team and there is a development pathway for them to progress to high level senior football.

There is a growing demand for adult football in the local community and in the year under review we added an adult male team which plays in the Barnet Sunday League and we will be starting an adult ladies team in the $2019 \, / \, 20$ season.

We have held trials for Under 7 players and this resulted in two new teams being established and we are operating a training group for Under 6 players. We have implemented the Football Association's 'Future Game' strategy and all of our Under 7 and Under 8 teams are now playing 5 v 5 matches on smaller pitches which aids the development of our young players by giving them more touches of the ball and providing a more enjoyable experience in their formative years.

We currently have a record number of teams and registered players and the Trustees are very optimistic about the future.

I would like to thank all of our Committee members, Coaches and other volunteers for the fantastic job which they have done in developing our Club to where it is today and for the contribution which they make to the local community.
