Para 1.17 and 1.19	<p>To undertake a wide range of activities to assure the preservation, accessibility and recovery of Suffolk's nationally and internationally significant archives.</p> <p>The CIO will initially focus on providing grants to support the building of a new archive and heritage centre in Ipswich. This facility, to be called 'The Hold' will be built through a partnership between the Suffolk County Council and the University of Suffolk. Although the CIO will be independent of both Suffolk County Council and The University of Suffolk, close liaison with the project is planned; however, the CIO will not undertake any activities in the furtherance of the running of these businesses.</p> <p>Initial fundraising for this project was begun by The Friends of Suffolk Record Office. It is envisaged that the new CIO will now take the lead role in fundraising for 'The Hold' and future significant projects of its type deemed necessary to support the archive service, beginning with the transfer of funds raised to date. This will allow The Friends of Suffolk Record Office to focus on their main objects; that being the purchase of at risk archives relevant to the county. The formation of the CIO is not intended to exclude the Friends of Suffolk Record Office or any other local history charity fundraising for the archive service.</p> <p>It is anticipated that the CIO will support future projects of this nature which aim to improve the facilities and services of all branches of the Suffolk Archive Service.</p> <p>It is anticipated that the CIO will be run by trustees with a broad range of experience in both fundraising and the archive sector, supported by volunteers and initially benefit from advice of the qualified professionals employed by Suffolk County Council on 'The Hold' project.</p>
