Directors' report for the period 1st September 2018 – 31st August 2019

The directors present their report and the financial statements for the period 1st September 2018 – 31st August 2019.

Objectives of the Charity

The objectives of the Pre-School are to enhance the development and education of children primarily under statutory school age by encouraging parents to understand and provide for the needs of their children through community groups and by:-

Offering appropriate play, education and care facilities and training courses, together with the right of parents to take responsibility for and to become involved in the activities of such groups, ensuring that such groups offer opportunities for all children whatever their race, culture, religion, means or ability;

Encouraging the study of the needs of such children and their families and promoting public interest in and recognition of such needs;

Instigating and adhering to and furthering the aims and objects of the Pre-School Learning Alliance.

Management

The governing documents of the company are its memorandum and articles of association.

The management of the charity is through a committee of volunteers who are the directors of the company. The day to day running of the charity is via a team of paid staff.

The pre-school is a registered charity (1137573) and is registered with Ofsted (123649).

Review of Activities

The pre-school had a very successful year with new staff and new committee members joining the management of the pre-school bringing fresh ideas to the organisation.

Child numbers were consistently high throughout the period and by the spring term all sessions were full, with further children on the waiting list.

Due to the high levels of children attending our setting, we have continued teaching children in two groups. The demand for Nursery age places this year has reduced, so nursery age children (rising 4 year olds) are being taught in the smaller downstairs room. This has allowed us to offer more spaces to new 2 & 3 year olds in the upstairs room.

County council funding continues to make up the majority of fees at our pre-school from 3 and 4 year old children, disadvantaged 2 year old families, Pupil premium, Exceptional needs, DLA and Inclusion funding.

Income from both county council funding and parent fees increased this year due to the high levels of children attending.

Wages increased this year due to a pay rise awarded in April, plus a rise in the minimum levels of pension contributions and the minimum wage that were bought into effect in April 2019.

Fundraising is crucial to the success of the pre-school and the directors' are pleased to report that £2.8k has been raised through events such as the sparkly party, rock 'n' roll bingo evening, sponsored bounce, water table at the St Albans Marathon and leaver's tea-towels. These funds will go towards new equipment and staff training. The children are enjoying a new climbing frame in the garden purchased in summer 2019.

Fundraising Income of just over £1k is being held in restricted reserves for Forest School training. We continue to investigate possible courses in outdoor play to enable us to support and develop our children.

An annual trip to Paradise Park, 'Dear Zoo' at the Alban Arena and Willows Farm, along with our annual fun day and children's Christmas party were highlights of the period and thoroughly enjoyed by the children and their carers.

The Directors wish to thank everybody who has helped and supported these events.

We continue to support our children with special needs and have welcomed new children who need additional help and support in the pre-school setting. We work closely with the families and relevant professionals to ensure that the best care is provided.

The Directors' extend their thanks to all the pre-school staff for their dedication, professionalism and enthusiasm during the period.

Review of Financial position

During the period the pre-school made a surplus of £10,952. Reserves at the end of the period were £150,732 of which £1,063 are restricted for funding staff outdoor training.

1. Accounting policies

1.1 Basis of preparation

The accounts have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

The accounts have been prepared in accordance with applicable accounting standards, the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective April 2008), the Statement of Recommended Practice, "Accounting and Reporting by Charities", issued in March 2005 and the Companies Act 2006.

1.2 Incoming resources

Fees, donations and grants are accounted for when receivable. Gifts and services in kind were not material in the period.

1.3 Resources expended

All resources are expended in furtherance of the provision of care, education and recreational facilities for the Pre-School children.

1.4 Taxation

The charity is exempt from corporation tax on its charitable activities.

1.5 Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statements.
