Chairman's report

In addition to our normal maintenance activity, we initiated three new projects

- The renovation of the Iron Age Hill Fort on Holmbury Hill. The scale of this work has required us to schedule this project over two years. The first stage, costing approximately £10,000 has been to clear the centre ground of the fort of encroaching undergrowth and bracken. The next stage will focus on clearing the ramparts which are still clear on the ground
- Clearance to show the outlines of the 1917 WW1 prisoner-of-war camp for civilian internments, traces of which still survive in the undergrowth. A new interpretation board is planned, funded by proceeds from the Holmbury St Mary November 5th Bonfire party
- The development of a new website and donor database.

Each of these projects is expected to be completed during 2020

Finance

The full financial results are included with this report. Our income remains steady, the main challenge is containing expenditure. Two items accounted for almost 10% of total expense, insurance premiums and the ever-increasing cost of removing fly-tip.

During the year the board considered it financially prudent to upgrade our tractor. Although only 5 years old, an excellent trade-in value was obtained for the old tractor, with a positive impact on the balance sheet.

Reserves

Our legacy reserves are invested in a portfolio of Funds managed by Octopus Investments on behalf of the Charities Aid Foundation. I am pleased to report that our original investment has performed in line with expectations

The balance of reserves is held in interest bearing Income Bonds at NS&I and in our current account at Unity Trust Bank plc.

The Trustee is confident that these reserves are adequate for a charity of our size.

Risk

The Risk Register is updated regularly to take account of the changing nature of the environment of the Hurtwood (e.g. trail erosion, forestry works), the potential for conflict between different users (e.g. fast moving bikers and horse riders), financial risk and various other issues (e.g. fly tipping and fire risks).

The Trustee has reviewed the updated risk register and are satisfied that appropriate and proportionate action is in place to mitigate the risks identified.

Operations Report

We've had a busy year on the Hurtwood, especially dealing with fly tipping as usual and including asbestos being dumped in large quantities. Asbestos is very costly to remove and continues to be a financial drain on our budgets that we have to bear in order to provide car parks for our visitors.

With the help of members of the local mountain bike community we have completed a new bike trail that moves cyclists away from the peaceful area of Peaslake Cemetery and also reduce use of the tarmac road past the church entrance. The new trail has also meant a safer exit into Walking Bottom car park, away from parked vehicles.

We started work on phase one of the Holmbury Hill Fort clearance in March 2019 with the mulching machine which cleared all the old rotten tree stumps left over from the initial felling. I was then able to go over the cleared area with the tractor and mower over the summer months to cut the Bracken and any shrubby regrowth. This will continue throughout this coming year. We have now started work on clearing the trees from the ditches and banks and will gradually work our way around to complete the clearance, hopefully by 2021.

In Summary during the year 2018/19 we have:

- Removed approx. 11 tons of fly tip from the car parks
- Cleared over 8 miles of paths
- Cleared fallen trees obstructing paths
- Regularly cut back grassy areas and rides
- Cut back extensive gorse re-growth from fire roads
- Given talks about the Hurtwood to various organisations, including local schools

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

Note 1 Accounting policies**Basis of accounting**

The accounts have been prepared under the historical cost convention with items recognised at cost or transaction value unless otherwise stated in the relevant notes to the accounts.

These accounts have been prepared in accordance with:
the Statement of Recommended Practice: Accounting and Reporting by Charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS102) issued on 16 July 2014
and with the Financial Reporting Stanadard applicable in the United Kingdom and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102 1A) and with the Charities Act 2011.

Change of accounting policy

The accounts present a true and fair view and the accounting policies are those outlined in this note.

Going concern

There are no material uncertainties about the charity's ability to continue.

Changes to accounting estimates

No changes to accounting estimates have occurred in the reporting period.

Material prior year errors

No material prior year errors have been identified in the reporting period.

Funds

Unrestricted funds represent the funds of Friends of the Hurtwood that are not subject to any restrictions regarding their use and are available for the general purpose of the trust. Funds designated by the Trustees for a particular purpose are also unrestricted.

Restricted funds consist of monies received for specific purposes. The unspent balances of the funds may not be used for any other purposes unless the Trustees have received, from the donors, express permission to do so.

Designated funds are unrestricted funds where the Trustees have resolved to set aside the funds for a specific purpose.

Designated Legacies Reserve is an unrestricted reserve that the trustees have set aside to fund projects that will enhance the efficiency of the Charity.

Recognition of income

Income is included in the Statement of Financial Activities when the charity becomes entitled to the resource, it is more likely than not that the trustees will recive the resource and the monetary value can be measured with sufficient reliability.

Depreciation

Depreciation is charged at the following rates:

Tractor - 10% per annum straight line
Pick-up Truck - 20% per annum reducing balance.
Signs and notice boards - 14 1/3% per annum straight line
Other equipment - 20% per annum reducing balance.
Computers and other IT equipment - 33 1/3% per annum straight line

Independent Examiner's Report to the Trustees of Friends of the Hurtwood

Summary of information required to be included in the Annual Report:

1. Name: Friends of the Hurtwood

2. Constitution: The Trust is an unincorporated association registered as a Charity The objects are contained in the Constitution adopted on 6th December 2000 and varied since that date. Copies will be available at the Annual Meeting if any Friends wish to see one.

3. Number: The registered Charity Number is 200053.

4. Members of the Trust: Membership is open to any person over the age of 18 who supports the objects of the Charity and subscribes or makes donations to the Charity on a regular basis or who otherwise applies to become a Member of the Charity.

5. Address: The address of the Charity and the name of the Secretary and Ranger appear on the back of the Annual Report.

6. Bankers: Unity Trust Bank PLC, Nine Brindleyplace, Birmingham, B1 2BR

7. There are no restrictions on the way in which the Trust operates nor are there any specific investment powers.

8. The Trust's objects, which are set out in the Constitution, are to administer the public rights of access to land on the Hurtwood placed by landowners within the Trust's control. The policies adopted by the Trust to further the objects are explained in the reports from the Chairman and Ranger.

9. Trustee and management: The sole Trustee is FOTH Trustee Company Limited. The names of its Directors appear on page 13. The Articles of Association of the trustee company provide for a maximum of 18 Directors, comprising 4 Landowner Representative Directors and 14 Independent Directors. The affairs of the Trust are controlled by the Trustee, whose Board meets at least twice a year. During the year the executive authority rested with the Chairman's Management Committee, which supervised the activities of the Secretary and Ranger, which is a full time executive post. At the date of the Annual Meeting, the Chairman's Management Committee comprises: Mr P. Copping (Chairman), Mr D Clifford, Mr A MacKinnon, Mrs Z Horton and Mr R Green.
