DIRECTORS/TRUSTEES REPORT FOR THE YEAR TO 31ST JULY 2019

The trustees (who are also the directors of the company) present their annual report and the financial statements for the year ending 31st July 2019.

The financial statements comply with the requirements of the Companies Act 2006, the Charities Act 2011, the Memorandum and Articles of the company, Financial Reporting Standard 102 and follow the recommendations in Accounting and Reporting by Charities with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable to the UK (FRS 102 effective 1st January 2015).

STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

The University of Bedfordshire Ecumenical Chaplaincy Trust is a company limited by guarantee (company number 06204411) and is registered as a charity (charity number 1119414). The governing instrument of the charitable company is the Memorandum and Articles of Association as revised by resolution on 15th October 2018. In view of the enhanced role of the company in overseeing the chaplaincy at all campuses of the University of Bedfordshire the name of the company was changed from Bedford Ecumenical Chaplaincy Committee as from 15th October 2018.

The membership has the legal responsibilities in the governance of the charity for electing the directors who are also the trustees. Its responsibilities also include: the admission and classification of members of the company/charity; agreeing procedures at general meetings and meetings of the directors/trustees; receiving the annual report and financial statements of the directors/trustees and appointing the independent examiner

Being a company limited by guarantee, there is also a board of directors who also act as trustees of the registered charity. The directors and trustees of the Charity throughout the year were:

The trustees manage the business of the charity and are responsible for ensuring that the charity is solvent, well-run, and delivering the charitable outcomes for which it has been set up, ensuring the charity complies with charity law and within the requirements of the Charity Commission, that the charity does not breach any of the requirements of its governing document and that it remains true to the charitable purpose set out there, acting with integrity and avoiding any personal conflicts of interest or misuse of the charity's funds or assets, appoints and regulating the financial affairs of the charity.

DIRECTORS/TRUSTEES REPORT FOR THE YEAR TO 31ST JULY 2019

The trustees may enter into contracts, appoint and employ staff, determine staff renumeration and conditions of service. The trustees endeavour to consult the membership and to inform it of their decisions.

The trustees meet at least three times a year. Time is given within trustee meetings to focus on their role and changes in legislation. When required, formal training or advice from consultants is received.

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES (INCLUDING REVIEW OF THE YEAR)

The Chaplaincy is an expression of the Churches' contribution to Higher Education and its support of the chaplains within the University of Bedfordshire. The Chaplain's purpose is to further that commitment to serve the University of Bedfordshire, and to engage with the University and its members, in particular by offering to the University the riches of the Christian faith.

In furthering this object, the Chaplaincy recognizes and rejoices in the multi-faith and multicultural nature of the University and pledges to work in partnership with people of all faiths and none.

During the year covered by this report the Company has continued to support the work of the Coordinating Chaplains, The Reverend Cassandra Howes and The Reverend Andrew Goodman and the team of Assistant Chaplains at all of the campuses of the University. The chaplaincy has provided pastoral support for students and members of staff of the University together with opportunities for prayer and friendship in the SeedBeds Centre on the Bedford Campus and the Treehouse on the Luton campus as well as through the annual carol services.

RISK REVIEW

The trustees regularly undertake a wide ranging appraisal in order to identify major risks to which the charity is exposed. Steps are taken with a view to mitigating these risks as far as is reasonably possible. Insurance, staff training and consciousness raising is regarded seriously and policies are in place and regularly reviewed to counter these risks.

The trustees are aware that continued financial stability of the charity relies on grant funding and service contracts together with donations from the local community. The trustees believe that the time frames for which its grant income is agreed is reasonably assured and that expenditure, linked to grants are also managed within similar time frames. The University of Bedfordshire Ecumenical Chaplaincy Trust is aware of the implications of the Disability Discrimination Act in all of its activities. Trustees and their staff have been made aware of, and are required to implement, data protection principles.

DIRECTORS/TRUSTEES REPORT FOR THE YEAR TO 31ST JULY 2019

PUBLIC BENEFIT

In compiling this report, the Trustees have given due regard to the public benefit guidance as issued by the Charity Commission. The trustees consider that the range of activities detailed above fulfil these requirements in that they benefit all members of the University community.

As a charity The University of Bedfordshire Ecumenical Chaplaincy Trust is committed to the advancement of the Christian religion, the promotion of religious harmony, and promoting cooperation, joint working and greater efficiency amongst its members. We believe that the Christian faith is of benefit to individuals and society because it has at its heart God's intent to reconcile all people and the whole of creation to Himself under Christ as head. This is a vision which encompasses peace and cohesion, mutual respect and self-giving love.

PLANS FOR THE FUTURE

The Trustees will continue to support the work of the Chaplaincy during the coming year. They will also be working with the University and the Diocese of St. Albans to bring into being a closer arrangement for management of the chaplaincies of the Bedford and Luton campuses of the University.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

The results for the year, as given in the Statement of Financial Activities, are considered satisfactory by the trustees. Provision has been made in the financial statements for correcting an underpayment to HMRC during a previous year.

RESERVES POLICY

It is the policy of the trustees to ensure that the charity has adequate reserves to enable it to meet both its ongoing commitments in regard to general charitable activities, and its future funding requirements. The trustees ideally require as reserves a minimum of three months expenditure in order to meet any contractual and winding up costs. The trustees consider the current level of reserves, although below this limit, to be sufficient for the present situation and requirements of the charity, but will continue to review the overall position and policy at regular intervals.

STATEMENT OF TRUSTEES RESPONSIBILITIES

NOTES ON THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR TO 31ST JULY 2019

1. Accounting policies

1.1 Basis of preparation of financial statements

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with the Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2015) and the Companies Act 2006.

1.2 Income

Grants have been credited to the Statement of Financial Activities in the period to which they refer.

1.3 Cash flow statement

The charitable company has not produced a cash flow statement since it has taken advantage of the small company exemption permitted under FRS 102.

1.4 Reserves policy

The charitable company is mainly funded by annual grants paid by participating denominations in accordance with a Declaration of Intent signed by representatives of the denominations and by the University of Bedfordshire, which are based on budgets prepared and agreed annually. The trustees aim to maintain funds equivalent to three months average expenditure.

1.5 Pensions

The charity operates a defined contribution pension scheme for the benefit of the employees. The assets of the scheme are administered by trustees in a fund independent from those of the charity. Contributions payable to the charity's pension scheme are charged to the profit and loss account in the period to which they relate.

1.6 Governance costs

The charity has identified the major costs of governance as being external costs related to independent examiners fee, insurance premiums and statutory company fees.

2. Segmental analysis.

All income and net assets are attributable to the principal activity of the charitable company which is the management and oversight of the Chaplaincy at the University of Bedfordshire Bedford Campus.

The charitable company only operates in the United Kingdom and the whole of its income derives from the United Kingdom.
