Structure, governance and management

The organisation was registered as a charity on 13th October 1999 with a declaration of trust by the incorporated governing body of the Bishop Wand Church of England School outlining the administration, objects and powers of the charity.

Structure, governance and management (continued)

The Board of Trustees currently has a membership of 17 people.

The Board meets regularly at least twice per year and more frequently if required. Sub groups are set up as needed to progress specific pieces of work. Recommendations are reported to the full Board meeting for decision. The Board is responsible for the strategic direction and policy of the organisation and for robust governance and rigorous financial management.

The Treasurer holds the day-to-day responsibility for the operational management of the charity. The Chair of Governors, Vice-Chair and Head Teacher are all authorised signatories of the charity.

Objectives and activities

The purpose of the Governors' and Friends' Fund is to advance the education of the pupils of The Bishop Wand Church of England School by providing or assisting in the provision of educational, recreational and other charitable facilities. The Governors' and Friends' Fund makes a contribution to the Chaplain's salary and makes grants to the school for various projects not covered by the funding from the Department for Education or other funding sources.

Achievements and performance

Trustees of the Governors' and Friends' Fund have agreed to cover all of the salary costs of the Chaplain, who greatly enhances the spiritual life of the school.

The Statutory Inspection of Anglican and Methodist Schools (SIAMS) in March 2015 judged the school as 'Outstanding' in all areas. It acknowledged that The Bishop Wand Church of England School meets the needs of all learners through its distinctive Christian character and the effectiveness of its religious education.

Financial review

The Governors' and Friends' Fund contributed to the school projects listed below to improve the pupil's education and recreational facilities.

- £24,615 Personal computers & monitors
- £5,182 Sixth Form Resources (Economics & UCAS)
- £3,786 GCSE revision software
- £2,500 Science equipment
- £1,032 Awards Evenings, Carol Service & Staff Appreciation

The fund has a surplus of £8,474 at the end of the year.

The amount of money raised from regular, one-off contributions and gift aid was £62,926. The cost of generating these funds was £2,344. This was in line with the budget. The Fund will be able to meet its commitments in the coming years. The trustees have decided to fund 100% of the Chaplain costs in 2019/20 and allocate £10,000 to fund projects. The Trustees will decide how the project funds should be spent in accordance with the charity's aims & objectives.

Notes to the Financial Statements

Year ended 31 July 2019

1. General information

The charity is a public benefit entity and a registered charity in England and Wales and is unincorporated. The address of the principal office is Layton's Lane, Sunbury-on-Thames, TW16 6LT.

2. Statement of compliance

These financial statements have been prepared in compliance with FRS 102, 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and the Republic of Ireland', the Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (Charities SORP (FRS 102)) and the Charities Act 2011.

3. Accounting policies Basis of preparation

The financial statements have been prepared on the historical cost basis, as modified by the revaluation of certain financial assets and liabilities and investment properties measured at fair value through income or expenditure.

The financial statements are prepared in sterling, which is the functional currency of the entity.

Going concern

There are no material uncertainties about the charity's ability to continue.

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds are available for use at the discretion of the trustees to further any of the charity's purposes.

Designated funds are unrestricted funds earmarked by the trustees for particular future project or commitment.

Restricted funds are subjected to restrictions on their expenditure declared by the donor or through the terms of an appeal, and fall into one of two sub-classes: restricted income funds or endowment funds.

Incoming resources

All incoming resources are included in the statement of financial activities when entitlement has passed to the charity; it is probable that the economic benefits associated with the transaction will flow to the charity and the amount can be reliably measured. The following specific policies are applied to particular categories of income:

- income from donations or grants is recognised when there is evidence of entitlement to the gift, receipt is probable and its amount can be measured reliably.
- legacy income is recognised when receipt is probable and entitlement is established.
- income from donated goods is measured at the fair value of the goods unless this is impractical to measure reliably, in which case the value is derived from the cost to the donor or the estimated resale value. Donated facilities and services are recognised in the accounts when received if the value can be reliably measured. No amounts are included for the contribution of general volunteers.
- income from contracts for the supply of services is recognised with the delivery of the contracted service. This is classified as unrestricted funds unless there is a contractual requirement for it to be spent on a particular purpose and returned if unspent, in which case it may be regarded as restricted.

3. Accounting policies (continued)

Resources expended

Expenditure is recognised on an accruals basis as a liability is incurred. Expenditure includes any VAT which cannot be fully recovered, and is classified under headings of the statement of financial activities to which it relates:

- expenditure on raising funds includes the costs of all fundraising activities, events, non-charitable trading activities, and the sale of donated goods.
- expenditure on charitable activities includes all costs incurred by a charity in undertaking activities that further its charitable aims for the benefit of its beneficiaries, including those support costs and costs relating to the governance of the charity apportioned to charitable activities.
- other expenditure includes all expenditure that is neither related to raising funds for the charity nor part of its expenditure on charitable activities.

All costs are allocated to expenditure categories reflecting the use of the resource. Direct costs attributable to a single activity are allocated directly to that activity. Shared costs are apportioned between the activities they contribute to on a reasonable, justifiable and consistent basis.
