Trustees' Report

Objectives and Activities for the Public Benefit

To relieve persons in the area of Redcar and Cleveland who are in condition of need, hardship or distress (beneficiaries) by providing practical support, information, guidance and in such other ways as the trustees from time to time see fit.

Achievements and Performance

This year has been our busiest to date – aiming to help reduce poverty and isolation through our various projects.

Throughout this period our Foodbank has taken in a total of 58 tonne of food and distributed over 53 tonne. This food has gone to 5343 people in need throughout Redcar and Cleveland; over one third of whom are children. Thanks to the generosity of local people who regularly donate to this cause. Our Next Step Shop offers a longer-term solution to food poverty and over the past 12 months has helped in excess of 230 individuals who have attended a total of 85 shop sessions.

Lunch Box is a popular project helping to alleviate holiday hunger during the summer school holidays. Over 100 children attended during the five weeks of August 2018 enjoying fun and games and taking away a packed lunch with them at the end of the session.

During this period we started a new project – Bridging the Gap. This project brings together the elderly residents of a local nursing home and pre-school children and their parent/carer for craft activities, games and action songs. This project recognises that even those who are surrounded by other people can still feel isolated. The impact on the residents has been amazing with staff at the nursing home commenting on both the physical and mental benefits to individuals.

Over this period we are grateful to over 200 volunteers who have helped to deliver our projects – we certainly couldn't achieve or help the hundreds of people we do without the support and dedication of our volunteers. In this period volunteers gave over 21,000 hours of their time!

Each year we conduct an external evaluation of our services - feedback from clients/members, staff and volunteers during this period was 100% positive, with volunteers and members of our Men's Shed in particular stating that attending Footprints helped to improve their mental health and form new friendships.

We are 100% committed to our local community, helping them through the difficult times and assisting them in any way we can.

The trustees/directors have considered the guidance produced by the Charity Commission on the provision of public benefit and they confirm that public benefit has been provided by the range of activities as described.

Financial Review

The Charity's financial results for the year are shown in the Statement of Financial Activities (SOFA), Balance Sheet and Notes to the Accounts.

Risk Management

All major risks are identified through a risk assessment process and systems have been put in place to mitigate these risks. The Trustees recognise the uncertainty over future income as the main risk facing the Charity. Grants are sought from a variety of funders as opportunities arise to reduce the dependence on any one source of funding.

Reserves Policy

It is the policy of the charity to try to build up unrestricted funds, which are free reserves of the charity, to a level that equates to approximately 3 - 6 months unrestricted expenditure. This will provide sufficient funds to management cover and administration support costs, redundancy liabilities and any emergencies that may arise from time to time.

Plans for the Future

The trustees and volunteers continue to target the local community to focus on marginalised people .We are developing an updated strategy that will see us unify our projects and make them far stronger than the 'sum of their parts'. The trustees aim to ensure adequate finances, staffing and volunteers to provide an excellent level of service. Footprints in the Community will continue to raise funds through activities and applications to charitable funders. This especially affects the Footprints Community Café where we hope to expand the cafe and catering side with the opening of new premises in the foreseeable future.

This is how we are working to improve and strengthen our reach and the ways we engage with people. Clearly, this is an exciting time for 'Footprints in the Community.'

Independent Examiners Report

1 Accounting Policies

Basis of Preparation

Basis of Preparation

These Financial Statements have been prepared in accordance with Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective January 2015) – Charities SORP (FRS 102).

Footprints in the Community meets the definition of a public benefit entity under FRS 102. Assets and liabilities are initially recognised at historical cost or transaction value unless otherwise stated in the relevant accounting policy note(s).

Incoming Resources

These are included in the Statement of Financial Activities (SOFA) when:

- the charity becomes entitled to the resources;
- the trustees are virtually certain they will receive the resources; and
- the monetary value can be measured with sufficient reliability

Donations are only included in the SOFA when the charity has unconditional entitlement to the resources.

Capital Grants are released over the economic useful life of the asset to which they relate

Resources Expended and Liabilities

Resources expended have been analysed using a natural classification.

Liabilities are recognised as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to pay out resources.

Taxation

The charity is exempt from corporation tax on its charitable activities.
