This should be good for another 10 to 15 years.				
benefit)	During the Autumn of 2019 we completed the planned external renovations of the entrance at the front and the car park side. This included new aluminium framed double glazed entrance doors and coloured rendering. As well as protecting and preserving the life of the brickwork, the render has greatly improved the appearance of the building and presents a more modern, warm and welcoming frontage to the church building.				
	Also during the Autumn, we upgraded all of the old fluorescent strip light fittings in the main hall areas and replaced them with new, energy efficient LED strip light units. This not only has improved the illumination of these areas but will also reduce our energy consumption.				
	At the end of the year we commenced the re-decorating and re-fitting of the entrance foyer area which will provide a brighter, fresher appearance along with replacing the noticeboards and new, modern light fittings. This is anticipated to complete in the Spring of 2020.



I have completed my examination. I confirm that no material matters have come to my attention in connection with the examination giving me cause to believe that in any material respect:


