Trustees are appointed as required following a recruitment process. The board of trustees agree all appointments and new trustees are appointed at the next trustee meeting. Trustees are given a copy of the constitution and business plan and latest annual report and statement of accounts when they commence their role.

Give Me Hope Africa Wales (GMHAW) works in partnership with Give Me Hope Africa (GMHA) which is based in Mbale Uganda. Initially as a constituted group we supported and contributed to their work. In 2017 GMHAW became a registered charity here in the U.K. We aim to continue working in partnership with GMHA to provide the funds to enable the completion of the medical/community centre.

The charity has developed links with Wales/Africa Hub and as a result had the opportunity to access information and training sessions for the board of trustees and members. Through this link we have also met with other charities working in a similar field to share good practise and learn from one another.

We work closely with our partners in Uganda and regularly review the systems and procedures we have in place.

#### Section D

### Achievements and performance

Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year

In 2018 we purchased land in Sironko, Uganda to build a medical/community centre. With the support of our partners Give me hope Africa who are based in Uganda and the local community of Sironko the building is now erected and the interior almost complete. In February of this year we recruited a project manager in Uganda on a part time basis to undertake an assessment of needs and strengthen relationships with our partners, local leaders and community members. We believe this work to be essential in identifying, preparing and planning for the future use of the centre.

We continue to fundraise throughout the year at local events. We took part in Abergavenny's food festival last September, where we provided refreshments, plus a range of items to sell including African goods, handmade, jewellery, scarfs and a selection of other items. We have several local schools which invite us to take part in their summer and winter events. We also look for opportunities to hold open air events which take place during the summer months and Christmas craft fayres during the winter months. We recently held an afternoon tea which gave an overview of our work in Sironko and an insight into the future plans of the charity. A local women's group have chosen us as their charity and make regular donations to us.

We are in regular contact with our partners in Uganda and have a robust system in place for monitoring and evaluating the incoming and outgoing of all finances associated with the building of the centre. Our project manager also provides us with a separate monthly report on the work he has carried out on our behalf. Each year at least one trustee with a member/s of the team plan a trip to Uganda to meet with our partners and have the opportunity to see for themselves the development of the project. Our last visit took place in October/November 2019. We did plan to visit in June/July 2020 but due to the outbreak of COVID 19 the trip has been cancelled.
