St Albans and London Colney Boxing Club ("the club") has an approved child protection policy in place, The club's appointed child protection officer has also held a number of senior social services positions within this field. The safeguarding framework in place is regularly reviewed by the Trustees.

All Trustees are subject to Criminal Records checks prior to the commencement of their positions.

Any coach used by the Charity need to be fully qualified with the Amateur Boxing Association of England (ABA), subject to enhanced CRB checks and must hold first aid certificates.

The club participates in training schemes run by Box Cleva, a multi award winning charity that provides sporting and educational initiatives centred on the sport of Amateur Boxing. The Box Cleva initiative is supported by both the Hertfordshire Fire & Rescue and Constabulary services.

All Trustees operate on a voluntary basis and receive no remuneration or other benefits for their role.

## Achievements and performance

#### 1. Overview

Another successful period for boxing club, measured through both the ever-increasing numbers of juniors attending the weekly training sessions as well as the competition success achieved by members within the ring. The continued success seen during the period underlines the effectiveness of the coaching programme developed and adopted within the club. The Trustees have ensured that the facilities and coaching are available to all to ensure that the charity is able to meet its stated objectives.

#### 2. Initiatives

The club has maintained its strong connection with the Box Cleva programme and has supported this initiative during the period. The Trustees are strong advocates of the benefit, discipline and self-worth that this programme can impart on those taking part. Box Cleva is non-contact beginners boxing class based on traditional values of boxing, discipline, hard work, respect and appreciation for your fellow sportsperson. The initiative runs concurrent with the school term and targeted at children aged between 7 and 14. Many of the attendees come to the programme referred by social services, the police or from schools. This coaching provides them an outlet to channel their focus and develop themselves as individuals.

#### 3. Competition Success

The club achieved competition success at the local, regional, national championship level, including trials at an International level during the year. All members have the opportunity to participate in boxing club shows or championships at a level appropriate to their ability.

#### 4. Boxing Show

The club organised the second of its tribute boxing shows in honour of the late Jamie Hulse, a former junior and then later advocate of the boxing club. The show brought together amateur boxers and celebrities from across the country to enjoy a dinner and evening of amateur bouts. The Trustees would like to thank all of those volunteers involved in the organisation of this event and recognise the hard work that went into making it such a success. Returns from this show greatly enhanced Income recorded for the year.

#### 5. Social Event

The club held its annual Barbeque and Awards Ceremony in July to mark the end of another successful season. This combined event was open to all coaches, boxers, parents /guardians to attend and offered the Trustees an opportunity to thank everyone for their hard work during the season.

The club hold cash at bank of £19,367 at the end of the year, all of which are unrestricted funds. The funds are held in order to meet any unforeseen expenditure and are available at immediate notice if required.

The Trustees have not set a minimum level of reserves to be held at the year- end, which is in line with the approach taken in previous periods. This policy will continue to be monitored during 2019.

The club's principal source of fund generation is from training fees, including income from the Box Cleva initiative. Additional income generated by the Tribute Show event significantly enhanced overall revenues for the year.

Direct donations decreased from previous years. It is noted that many local businesses supported the club through buying tables at the tribute show this year rather than directly donating to the club individually.

Expenditure levels remained consistent with the previous period, although cost related to club events, travel and Insurance increased. All are in line with expectations for the period and activities undertaken.

The club did not seek any additional grant applications during the period. This still remains an area that the Trustees would like to focus on in the future to strengthen the clubs future.
