1 Reference and Administrative Information

The registered name of the charity is Friends of Bethlehem University, GB Charity (the Charity). The address at which the Charity can be contacted is its registered office, Keyston House, 61 Putnoe Lane, Bedford, MK41 9AE.

2 Structure, Governance and Management

The Charity is a Charitable Incorporated Organisation and on 29 June 2018 it was entered on the Register of Charities held by the Charities Commission (England and Wales), registered number 1178996. It is governed by its Constitution which became effective on that date. New Trustees are appointed by existing Trustees.

The Trustees have given consideration to the risks to which the Charity is exposed and satisfied themselves that systems or procedures are in place to manage those risks. Within that review, the Trustees reviewed the adequacy of CUCT's internal controls. Appropriate insurance cover has been purchased.

3 Objects and Activities

The object of the Charity is for the public benefit to advance education and learning anywhere in the world, in particular, but not limited to, among the people of the Holy Land irrespective of their religion, gender, ethnicity, age or sexual orientation. The Charity may not authorise an application of its assets for purposes which are not charitable.

In particular, the Charity has power to support Bethlehem University and all similar institutions with which Bethlehem University has formal and informal relationships for the benefit of humanity. The Charity intends that Bethlehem University will be its prime beneficiary.

The Trustees have complied with their duty to have due regard to public benefit guidance produced by the Charity Commission.

Funds will be raised by appeals to individuals and charities.

4 Achievements and Performance

The Charity has been successfully set up and new trustees have been appointed. There is close contact with several members of staff at Bethlehem University. Donations have been received from some donors who supported a previous charity which was closed on 29 October 2017. Other donations have been made following visits to Bethlehem University or the receipt of issues of Bethlehem University News.

5 Financial Review

During the year, donations of £79,205 and gift aid of £2,814 were received. In the six months to 31 December 2018, the receipts were £15,037 and £702 respectively. Donations of £81,485 (prior period £7,932) were made to Bethlehem University.

At the end of the year, the Charity had net assets of £2,292 (2018: £3,296).

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR TO 31 DECEMBER 2019

1 Trustees' responsibilities

The Trustees are responsible for preparing the Trustees' Report and Financial Statements in accordance with applicable law and United Kingdom Accounting Standards (United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice). They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the company and for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

2 Accounting policies

3 Basis of preparation

These Financial Statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice aplicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the United Kingdom and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2019) - (Charities SORP (FRS 102)) and the Charities Act 2011.
