The objects of the Society are to educate the public in the dramatic and operatic arts and generally to develop public appreciation and taste for these areas.

The charity is administered by a Management Committee, consisting of elected officers and six other members of the Society.

Activities include the production of theatrical productions, the hiring out of the theatre and of the Society's wardrobe.

#### **REVIEW OF PROGRESS AND ACHIEVEMENTS**

Firstly we must thanks all those who have given of their time, their experience, their skills and their commitment to the work of the Society and the Theatre, but, once again, we must mention the marked shortage in people coming forward to offer their services, especially those of younger years. The old guard cannot go on for ever.

Still a full programme within our means has been fulfilled. Our own productions started with "Upside Down at the Bottom of the World", directed by David Faulkner, featuring a period in Australia in the life of the writer DH Lawrence. It was brilliantly done and David rightly won the Best Director Award at the CDA Presentation Evening later in the year. Well done, David! It also earned other nominations for awards. Congratulations to all those involved too.

Later, Andy Fox directed "The Odd Couple", set in America, a very entertaining comedy, again we congratulate Andy and everyone on the high standard of production.

Finally, we came back home to Cornwall with our last play, "Ladies in Lavender", directed by Susie Bundy. A gentle comedy, with touches of pathos, set in the 1930s. Well done everyone! Also, it was pleasing to see some fresh faces, including younger ones in these productions.

All three plays were well-received by our audiences, which at times were rather thin, but this drop in revenue has been offset by some well-attended visiting presentations. These visiting events include tribute bands, musical performances, comedy, drama, pantomime and psychic mediums. Towards the end of the year we hosted the Newquay Stage Company (formerly the Newquay Operatic Society). Many of these acts will be returning next year. This year the pantomime group increased their run from two to three days.

In addition, a religious group meet regularly on a Sunday, the Newquay U3A meet here and local organisations hold meetings occasionally. Fitting these visiting groups into our own schedule is a difficult juggling act, and we hope not too many people are disappointed, but it is not possible to please everyone all of the time. If we can provide Newquay with a varied programme of theatrical experiences in a live situation we feel we are fulfilling our Aims and Objectives.

As a result of last year's activities our finances are continuing on an even keel and one loan has been now paid off. With the roof refurbished, we had the outside repainted professionally this year, and are now looking into providing a more viable surface for the carpark.

Finally I wish to thank all Committee Members and all Society Members for their continued commitment, especially Sheila Lines who has served the Society diligently for many, many years, most of them as Publicity Officer, but also acting and directing most successfully, and is now standing down. We look forward to 2020.

# Independent Examiners' report to the trustees on the unaudited financial statements of Newquay Dramatic Society
