Cranbrook Kent TN17 3HF **Status**: The Charity was formed by a Trust Deed dated 25th January 1988 as supplemented by a new Trust Deed dated 24th July 2017; the Trustees are appointed by the continuing Trustees.

Objects: i) The advancement of education through:-

- (a) The preservation for the public benefit of gardens in Kent and any buildings, structures and plant collections in such gardens;
- (b) The improvement of amenities in gardens in Kent
- (c) The encouragement of access to and study of gardens in Kent
- ii) The encouragement of the use and occupation of gardens in Kent for charitable purposes
- iii) The promotion and encouragement in Kent of education and research relating to gardens

Organisation: The Charity is managed by its Trustees, aided by volunteers and part time secretarial services.

Finance: This year saw a surplus of income over expenditure of £1,613, resulting in the funds standing at £30,873 as against £29,260 on the 31st December 2017. Both expenditure and receipts were higher in 2018 due to grants received and costs incurred for the publication of Humphry Repton in Kent book. Book sales are continuing for both this book and the Capability Brown in Kent book.

Expenditure on the Newsletter was higher in 2018 as a mini newsletter was published in February The reserves are held on deposit with Barclays Bank and COIF. Following a membership drive some 40 new members joined at a new subscription rate, which will be applicable to existing members from mid 2019. It is the policy of the trustees to build reserves to a level of two years' average gross expenditure, as and when conditions permit.

Activities:

In furtherance of the objects of the trust, the following activities took place.

Various activities were arranged to mark the 200th anniversary of the death of seminal landscape gardener Humphry Repton. A lecture by distinguished garden historian John Phibbs was held in May, and was followed by the first of two study days, the first at Brightling in Sussex, and the second in October at Cobham Hall.

A garden party for members and key figures from the Kent gardening world was held in July at Torry Hill, the home of our President, Lady Kingsdown.

Seven visits to historic gardens were organized throughout the summer and autumn period. Six of these were in gardens in Kent, one to the City of London gardens.

Research The research group continued their work in and around Dover, and the results of their activities were published in 2018

Planning Application Reviews We have increased our ability to review and respond to planning applications made in Kent which have an impact on a listed park or garden. This activity is carried out in close consultation with The Gardens Trust.

Education Our exhibition on Capability Brown's work in Kent was displayed in Maidstone Library, and then transferred to the Dover Library.

Archbishop's Palace Garden in Maidstone. We continue to oversee the maintenance and further restoration of this famous historic garden.

1 Accounting policies

Basis of preparation

The accounts have been prepared in accordance with Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2015), the Charities Act 2011 and UK Generally Accepted Practice as it applies from 1 January 2015

The charity constitutes a public benefit entity as defined by FRS 102.

Fund accounting

The Unrestricted Fund is available for use at the discretion of the trustees in furtherance of the general objectives of the charity.

The Restricted Fund represents donations and grants received in respect of the book to mark the 200th anniversary of the death of Humphry Repton.

Income recognition

All income is recognised once the charity has entitlement to the income, there is sufficient certainty of receipt and so it is probable that the income will be received, and the amount of income receivable can be measured reliably.

Grant income is received from various sources. The grant is usually awarded for a specific period. If any proportion of the grant does not relate to the accounting period in question, the amount is deferred to the period to which it relates.

Expenditure recognition

Liabilities are recognised as expenditure as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to that expenditure, it is probable that settlement will be required and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably.

All expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis.

Expenditure on charitable activities comprises those costs incurred by the charity in delivery of its activities. It includes both costs allocated directly to such activities and those costs of an indirect nature necessary to support them.

Irrecoverable VAT is charged against the expenditure heading for which it was incurred.

Tangible fixed assets and depreciation

Tangible fixed assets are stated at cost less depreciation.

Depreciation has been provided at the following rates in order to write off the assets over their estimated useful lives.

Office equipment

25% straight line

Debtors and creditors receivable/payable within one year

Debtors and creditors with no stated interest rate and receivable or payable within one year are recorded at transaction price. Any losses arising from impairment are recognised in expenditure.

Tax

The charity is an exempt charity within the meaning of schedule 3 of the Charities Act 2011.

Going concern

The financial statements have been prepared on a going concern basis as the trustees believe that no material uncertainties exist. The trustees have considered the level of funds held and the expected level of income and expenditure for 12 months from authorising these financial statements. The budgeted income and expenditure is sufficient with the level. of reserves for the charity to be able to continue as a going concern.
