We have supported over 460 people living with dementia. We have helped with claims for attendance allowances, blue badge, and carers applications. We have supported people to events in the community. We have a drop in for advice, training a 'person centred' course and crisis intervention.

We want to thank CO-OP for a local fund.

Financial Review & risks

The aim of the charity is to accrue enough funds to cover general running expenses for a calendar year as a buffer for survival.

The charity recognises risks to its reputation resulting from the actions of paid or unpaid staff acting without the policies and procedures in which all have been trained. Reviews of procedures and supervision of those involved in the work of the charity seek to minimise these risks.

All staff are unpaid volunteers and all DBS checks have been carried out and paid for.


All policies and procedure are understood by each individual volunteer in each area of process.
