#### **Christian Books. Trustees Annual Report 2019**

2019 was a very challenging year for the Bookshop resulting in a downturn of sales and with the exception of November and December, each month had seen sales slipping. Overheads have been reduced due to steps implemented at the end of 2018, viz. reduced purchases and the Manager working one day per week for the church, thus minimising the actual annual loss incurred.

Book sales represent 63% of turnover, although actual numbers of books sold was less, due to the challenging market and online buying. It was noted that the external events of Conference and Bookstalls greatly contributed to the overall total number of sales and book takes were provided for the Carey Pastors' Conference, Saved2Serve Youth weekend, Pilgrims' Friend Society, Grace Baptist Assembly, Foundations 19 Suffolk Conference, Grace Baptist Partnership Conference and Grace Baptist Women's Conference.

Seven Christmas bookstalls were held in local churches, giving opportunity for purchasing good quality Christian literature for those unable to travel to the shop in Dunstable.

Three Open evenings were held at the Bookshop during November, affording further opportunity to purchase for those who find it difficult to get to the shop during normal open hours.

Ministry opportunities continue as people come into the shop, sometimes for a coffee or just for someone to talk to. Relationships are built with the local community and opportunities given to invite members of the public to church meetings or events they might find beneficial.

We continue to be thankful for the Volunteers who assist by covering the shop during open hours while the Manager and/or Asst. Manager are attending external events etc.
