# Scaynes Hill Millennium Village Centre

## Chairman's Report 2020

(Including Buildings Report)

The centre continues to thrive and is on a sound financial and business footing. We are planning to continue building up our reserves to enable us to weather any reduction in income or major repair requirements.

During the year we made some additional investments in the centre. We upgraded the sound system to provide the facility in both halls. The system is now much more straight forward to use and more reliable. We have replaced the lighting in the Millard Hall with LED panels. These provide a warm and pleasant atmosphere and will be less expensive to run. We also installed a defibrillator at the centre.

The trustees are looking into further investment in the centre that will be both environmentally beneficial and reduce ongoing running costs. We will take any appropriate opportunity to help secure the long term sustainability of our centre.

We have not increased the hire rates and have no plans to do so at this time.

Since the year end, we have installed a new access control system on the front door. Individual user groups will have their own access codes, that will be time and date specific as appropriate. It is now possible to program the system remotely and lock and unlock the door remotely.

We already have many people who support the centre in many ways both regularly and occasionally. I thank you most sincerely on behalf of the centre – you know who you are!

The current restrictions imposed due to the pandemic mean that the centre has been closed since lock down started. We received £10k from the government as part of their support packages. The centre is in a very sound financial position and will be ready to reopen as soon as we get clearance to do so.

It is hoped that the village will continue to become more involved with the centre and we will use as many volunteers as possible to ensure the centre remains a valued asset in our community. If you can spare some time to support the centre in any way, please get in touch. If you have any skill that you could offer to the centre or know of anyone else who may be prepared to help, please let us know. (i.e. Builder, Window Cleaner, Tradesman, Lawyer, Roofer, Engineer etc.).

It has been an excellent year for the centre, and I am very grateful to those who have supported us.
