Review of activities

During the year the club continued the provision of swimming facilities.

The trustees are satisfied that all activities undertaken on behalf of the club are in accordance with the governing document and are in keeping with the aims and strategy of the charity.

We have 6 new Volunteers on committee, 6 poolside helpers waiting for a course, we have assistance with Swim Shop and Website. 3 level one coaches, 1 Level 3 coach and 1 level 2 teacher qualified.

8 timekeepers qualified, 1 J1, 1J2S, 1 Referee qualified and 1 in the J2 programme.

Need 1 person to attend team manager course.

Several swimmers have joined the club from SLT lessons and a promotion day at Tipton by Mark Deakin and leaflets distributed continuously throughout the year. Quite a few swimmers from Wednesbury swimming sessions.

Swimmers have attended Northgate, Hereford, Nuneaton, Wyre Forest, Haden Hill, Boldmere, Leicester Sharks, Putteridge, Stafford, Basildon and County Development meets. We also had 1 swimmer attend Worcester County Development camp, 11 swimmers at the Worcester Counties and 3 swimmers at the Regionals.

Our Masters section is growing after starting last year and swim Monday and Tuesday evening.

The club is indebted to the volunteers that make contributions to the running of events and galas, raising funds and especially running the squad and teaching sessions. The club thanks all the teachers and coaches who are continuing the progress of the Club's swimmers.

ACCOUNTING POLICIES 1.

Accounting convention

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention, and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective April 2008), the Charities Act 2011 and the requirements of the Statement of Recommended Practice, Accounting and Reporting by Charities.

Incoming resources

All incoming resources are included on the Statement of Financial Activities when the charity is legally entitled to the income and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy.

Resources expended

Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

Stocks

Stocks are valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value, after making due allowance for obsolete and slow moving items.

General fund

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statements.

Volunteer help

The value of voluntary help received is not included in the accounts but is described in the trustees' annual report.
