# Annual Report of the Trustees of the New London Music Society September 2019

The New London Music Society (NLMS) was formed in 1981 by the conductor Terence Lovett. The object of the Society was to promote, improve, develop and maintain public education and appreciation of the art and science of music in all its aspects. In recent years, this has been undertaken by the promotion and organisation of annual music summer schools and, since 2014, an annual residential course for string chamber music.

Each year the NLMS Summer School welcomes over a hundred enthusiastic adult amateur musicians for a week of enjoyable music making, with expert tuition from experienced music tutors. For 2019, the Society made a successful transition of venue to Downe House School in Berkshire. In the light of continued positive feedback from participants, the Society also ran a sixth chamber music weekend in Yorkshire.

### Trustees

- 1. There were six Trustees of the Society in 2018-19: Philip Meaden (Chair), Steve Walker (Secretary), Lorraine Collins, Tessa Crilly, Euan McCandless and Jacob Ashworth. From its inception, the Society was a membership association, the Trustees of which were elected by resolutions of the members at Annual General Meetings. The Society remains a membership association.
- 2. To address the concerns about the Society's constitution expressed by the committee in previous years, the following process was decided:
  - a. That a new organisation, called New London Music Association (NLMA), should be set up as a Charitable Incorporated Organisation (Foundation Model); this was done and the NLMA constitution has been approved by the Charity Commission and by NLMS members at the 4/8/2019 Annual General Meeting.
  - b. That NLMA will run the customary two courses in 2020.
  - c. That at the NLMS Year End of September 30 2019, NLMS will be wound up and its assets transferred to NLMA. In practice, this process has taken longer than anticipated, exacerbated by the 2020 pandemic. NLMA has not been active during 2018/19, nor to date at July 2020. It is anticipated that the transfer of assets from NLMS to NLMA will be complete by 30<sup>th</sup> September 2020.
- 3. The Society's correspondent is Dr Tessa Crilly, Secretary of the NLMS/NLMA.

#### Finance

- 1. The financial statement for the year ending 30th September 2019 shows a small surplus; income (£96,564) exceeded expenditure (£90,212) for the year by £6,352.
- 2. The Society's reserves stand at a total of £71,908. Reserves are held to enable the Summer School to withstand potential drop in income, e.g. through change of venue, uncertainty in recruitment patterns, and other general risks. Reserves represent less than one year of turnover and, following a full risk assessment by the Trustees, are deemed proportionate.
- 3. The Financial Statement is contained in Appendix A.

#### Courses

In 2018-2019 the New London Music Society organized two major events: a string chamber music weekend; and another offering in the longstanding and successful series of music summer schools.

#### **Chamber Music Weekend**

- 1. The chamber music weekend consisted of pre-formed groups only, coached, as before, by an established professional quartet.
- 2. Recruitment was good and the feedback from the participants was very positive, which enabled the Society to plan a further, similar, offering in 2020.

#### **Music Summer School**

- 1. The 2019 Summer School was held at Downe House School for the first time. It was an excellent venue and the school agreed that the Summer School would be welcome to return in 2020.
- 2. The 2019 Summer School consisted of four courses: two orchestras, (the Symphony Orchestra for those of Grade 8 standard, and the Sinfonietta for those of Grades 5-7), the String Ensemble (for early stage players) and the Choir "Choral Singing for Pleasure".
- 3. Specialist tutors coached sectional rehearsals focused on concert repertoire for both orchestras and the Choir. The String and Wind Ensembles were coached by tutors who have specialized in teaching adults. Tutors also led the string sections of both orchestras, and the Choir sections. String, wind and brass ensembles were also timetabled, again coached by relevant tutors.
- 4. The 2019 Summer School also proved to be a happy and successful occasion with excellent feedback from the members.
