Review of the year and plans for future periods.

Once again it has been a busy year. We have continued to show monthly films through the C-Fylm scheme and now have found a solid and loyal fan-base, with regular audiences in the 30s-40s. We have continued with the policy of showing films that have received critical acclaim and/or have been nominees or winners at the BAFTAs, Golden Globes or Oscars. Our programme has covered a wide range of genres and has encompassed musicals ("Mamma Mia Here We Go Again", "Bohemian Rhapsody", "A Star Is Born" and "Fisherman's Friends"), Comedy ("Stan & Ollie"), Space Adventure ("First Man"), History ("The Favourite"), Politics ("Red Joan") and Social Critique and Drama ("BLACKKKLANSMAN", "The Wife", and "Green Book").

Our live performances have also covered a broad spectrum: The Drystones opened up the world of folk music, while Thomas Bowes' "Bach Pilgrimage" offered an outstanding performance of well-known works. Pangottic's skillful display of juggling and circus skills in "Lomngshot" had younger members of the audience wide-eyed in amazement, while Zulu Tradition brought all the colour and excitement of Zulu song and dance to the stage. All the acts were absolutely first-class and we still remain somewhat bemused by the very changeable audience numbers.

Our thanks must go to Callington Primary School for letting us use their hall as a venue for one of them and particular thanks must go to lan Aspen, the caretaker, for providing so much help and support.

Equally we are indebted to the support of the Callington Town Hall staff for the support they offer, both as a box-office outlet and in their role in preparing the venue. The supervision provided at the get-in and get-out of each performance is much appreciated. A big thank you to them!

We are very much indebted to Carn to Cove for the support that Claire, Tim and Imogen provide, both in terms of the subsidised events and also in providing contact details for both touring and local companies. We do get regular positive feedback from artistes on the warm welcome they receive from us – and in particular the delicious food provided by Marian!

MayFest continues to thrive and is now regarded by many as one of the highlights in Callington's social calendar. It has become Callington's largest participative community event and is extremely well supported, not only by those attending the event but also by local businesses who support it through advertising and sponsorship. We thank every one of them. The financial support provided by feast and the funding from the National Lottery and the Arts Council is obviously invaluable; it draws good crowds; there is a big buzz about it in town before, during and after the event. We hope that it also plays an important role in bringing life and economic vitality back to the streets of Callington. All high streets are suffering and anything we can do in terms of increasing the footfall and people's awareness of what is on offer in Callington can only be a good thing. Preparations for the 2020 event were well underway when the Coronavirus pandemic struck. But more of that in next year's report! Suffice it to say that we intend to be back with MayFest in 2021!

I am greatly indebted to Pete and Marian for the untiring work they have put in and also to Geoff who is now a kingpin in the organisation. It has also been great to have Peter "back in the fold" and we look forward to sharing his good ideas. We have also had support from Heather, Sue and Maggie at a number of events, with Sue and Wanda also helping out. Our existence as a CIO, a Community Interest Organisation, continues to run seamlessly.

Thank you all once again for "attending" today – albeit in virtual reality - and I look forward to your continued support.

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Notes to the accounts for the year ended 5th April 2020

(1) Principal Accounting Policies

The principal accounting policies adopted in the preparation of the financial statements are set out below and have remained unchanged from the previous year.

(a) Basis of preparation

The charity constitutes a public benefit entity as defined by FRS 102. The financial

statements have been prepared in accordance with Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) 2nd edition and the Charities Act 2011.

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

(b) Fund accounting

[i] Unrestricted funds are available for use at the discretion of the trustees in furtherance of the general objectives of the charity.

[ii]Designated funds are unrestricted funds earmarked by the Management Committee for particular purposes.

[iii] Restricted funds are subjected to restrictions on their expenditure imposed by the donor

or through the terms of an appeal.

(c) Income

Income is included in the statement of financial activities when the charity

is entitled to the income and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy. The following specific policies are applied to particular categories of income.

[i] Income received by way of grants, donations and gifts and is included in full

in the Statement of Financial Activities when receivable. Grants, where entitlement is not conditional on the delivery of a specific performance by the charity, are recognised when the charity becomes unconditionally entitled to the grant.

[ii] Donated services and facilities are included at the value to the charity where this can be quantified.

[iii]The value of services provided by volunteers has not been included in these accounts.

[iv] Investment income is included when receivable.

[v]Income from charitable trading activity are accounted for when earned.

[vi]Income from grants, where related to performance and specific deliverables,

are accounted for as the charity earns the right to consideration by its performance.

(d) Expenditure

Expenditure is recognised on an accrual basis as a liability is incurred. Expenditure includes any VAT which cannot be fully recovered

[i]Costs of generating funds comprise the costs associated with attracting voluntary income and the costs of trading for fundraising purposes.

[ii] Charitable expenditure comprises those costs incurred by the charity in the delivery of its activities and services for its beneficiaries. It includes both costs that can be allocated directly to such activities and those costs of an indirect nature necessary to support them [iii]All costs are allocated between the expenditure categories of the SoFA on a basis designed to reflect the use of the resource. Costs relating to a particular activity are allocated directly, others are apportioned on an appropriate basis.
