- 1) To advance any appropriate charitable purpose for the benefit of the older people (people aged 50 years or older) in Kilburn and the surrounding area.
- (2) To advance education of the public and raise awareness in the community of topics that impact on older people.

The main activities of Kilburn Older Voices Exchange (KOVE) in 2019-20 were:

- a) Organising community meetings to discuss issues of concern to local older people, and identify issues to campaign on.
- b) Organising meetings to provide older people with information on issues such as health, transport and local facilities.
- c) Organising local walks to provide both exercise and a social activity to overcome isolation.
- d) To support a local film club to provide social activity and overcome isolation
- e) During the lockdown period (March 2020), to contact members regularly by telephone and email to offer support and information.
- f) To work in partnership with other organisations in the local area and in London to promote the charity's objectives, in particular Ageing Better in Camden, Age UK Camden and the National Pensioners Convention.
- g) To publicise activities and facilities for older people.
- h) To campaign for better street furniture, in particular benches, for older people; to campaign for better public transport facilities and road crossing times, and to campaign for better public toilet facilities.

The trustees are aware of the guidance from the Charity Commission on public benefit.

We regularly involve volunteers in our work. Areas where volunteers make an important contribution include the local walks, community forums and meetings, campaigns, the film club we support and intergenerational activities in partnership with a local library.

Volunteers are also involved in the meetings of our Steering Group, and meetings organised by Ageing Better in Camden and Age UK Camden.

We recruited 13 new volunteers during the year.

1,000 people in total attended our activities. (NB The figures are slightly lower than last year due to the lockdown in March)

There are 49 local, regional or national organisations that we work with.

The 2019–20 year was an important and productive one for KOVE. The main focus of our work continued to be the activities funded by Ageing Better in Camden, funded by the Big Lottery. These are covered in detail in other parts of this report.

Governance

The Steering Group was elected at the 2019 AGM, and has been attended regularly by its members. Sadly, one member died during the year, and a replacement will be elected at the 2020 AGM. The meetings were still open to any KOVE member to attend, and were able to discuss and review the organisation's work.

Campaigning

We continued to campaign on issues that affect local people. The bench on Shoot Up Hill in Camden for which we had secured funding was installed, and we held an opening ceremony with a local councillor in December 2019. Funding was also received from Brent Council for five new benches in Kilburn High Road. Installation has been temporarily delayed due to a larger scheme to develop Kilburn High Road; it has been agreed that our benches will be part of that. The pandemic meant a further delay, but we hope it will restart in late 2020. We would like to thank the local councillors and officers from both councils for their help and support. Benches are important for older people, both as places to rest while out and to meet at socially.

We have also continued to work on local transport issues, and are regularly consulted by Camden Council. Some members attended street assessments organised by Camden to provide an older person's perspective. Another success, in partnership with London Living Streets, was to have the road crossing time on a major junction on Kilburn High Road increased. There are several other junctions where we will raise this issue.

We have continued to support the Friends of Hampstead Cemetery in securing a publicly accessible toilet to cover the area around the cemetery. This long-running saga was near resolution when the lockdown in March caused further delay.

We have maintained our links with the Webheath Estate Tenants and Residents Association and continued to support their campaign to improve their estate, which includes a sheltered housing scheme.

We encourage our members to be active on local and national issues affecting older people.

Achievements and performance

Walks

The walks programme has continued to develop. In the winter months it often involves visiting a museum or exhibition, including the British Museum, organised in partnership with their community outreach team. We have visited various parks in the summer, and also explored the Farringdon area of London, which is rich in history. The walks achieve several of our targets – they provide gentle exercise; are a social occasion, always ending in a café for tea and coffee; and often mean that our members visit new places which they can then visit again independently. We always provide illustrated notes on each area or place we visit. Many of our members use these to find out more and/or to go back for a second visit.

Local activities

Our local groups continued to meet regularly, and are covered elsewhere in this report.

The film club found a better venue. An unexpected donation enabled us to buy equipment so we can now screen films without having to rely on other group's equipment. We can also use the projector and screen for illustrated talks, which are very popular.

We held two successful concerts in partnership with the Kilburn & West Hampstead Pensioners, one of which included a performance by a local primary school choir. We hope to involve them in future concerts.

Following work by the Ageing Better in Camden Outreach team at Vivian Court, a large sheltered housing scheme in Kilburn run by Central & Cecil Housing Trust, we were asked to run Bingo and Boccia (indoor bowls) there once a month. The sessions ran from February 2019 to December 2019. From this initiative, the residents relaunched their tea club, which takes place after the session.

KOVE was again represented at the Jester Festival. This well-established popular festival usually takes place over the first weekend of July at Fortune Green. We had a stall on the Saturday, and met at least 25 KOVE members, networked with other groups, and gave out our recruitment literature.

Partnerships and local groups

The Stroke Freedom Support Group, backed by us, continued to meet regularly and had a variety of speakers. Our Arthritis Group also met monthly, with speakers on different topics. Both groups offer support to members with long-running medical conditions.

There is an ongoing interest in local history, and we organised three meetings with speakers who gave illustrated talks on the history of Kilburn and West Hampstead. These are popular, and attracted new members.

We continue to work with a wide variety of groups – local, London-based and national. In some cases, this just involves exchanging information and newsletters. In others, some partners come to speak at our meetings. One of the most useful this year was London Living Streets. Their chair spoke at our AGM, and we have subsequently worked with them on various transport issues.

The National Pensioners Convention is the main organisation that campaigns on issues facing older people, and we regularly receive information from them. Our co-ordinator, Peter Lush, attended their

Achievements and performance

Pensioners Parliament in Blackpool, which had discussions and debates about a wide variety of issues facing older people.

Of course, one of our most longstanding partnerships is with the Kilburn & West Hampstead Pensioners Action Association. Most of their members are also members of KOVE, and provide a nucleus of volunteers and people to support our work. Special thanks to Phyllis Young, their secretary (and KOVE trustee) for her long-running work with the Association.

We also hold regular community meetings in the Swiss Cottage and Sidings areas.

Thanks also to Bernie O'Hara, the scheme manager at Sycamore Court. Bernie has provided us with a meeting room where we are always made welcome. She has also encouraged the residents at Sycamore Court to join in KOVE's activities. Many thanks to Bernie and we look forward to continuing to work with her in the future.

And finally, thanks to all the staff at Ageing Better in Camden – Corinna, Annabel and Harriet– for their consistent support. It is very encouraging to see that the project has grown from a handful of groups in the beginning to over 20 now. We are proud to have been one of the founder members, and Ageing Better in Camden has provided us with ongoing support.

Publicity

We continued to issue a newsletter once a quarter, which is sent by post and email. We also send the newsletter to local community groups, community centres, libraries and religious groups in our area, and to local councillors. We put more time and resources into our website this year, ensuring that it was always up to date. We issued a copy of our Annual Report to all members.

In conclusion, this was a successful year for Kilburn Older Voices Exchange, with a wide variety of activities and campaigns, and an increase in our membership. However, we are now entering the final year of our current funding from Ageing Better in Camden, and as well as supporting our members through the pandemic, will have to find new sources of funding to continue our work at this level in the future.

Basis of preparation
