The charity provides pre-school education for children in the local area aged between 30 months and school age.

Summary of the objects of the charity set out in its governing document

Our setting aims to:

- Provide high quality care and education for children below statutory school age;
- Work in partnership with parents to help children to learn and develop;
- Add to the life and well-being of the local community; and
- Offer children and their parents a service that promotes equality

and values diversity.

Members of the charity are the parents of children in our care and have full participatory rights. These include a right to be:

- valued and respected;
- kept informed;
- consulted;
- involved; and
- included at all levels.

We aim to ensure that each child:

- is in a safe and stimulating environment;
- is given generous care and attention, because of our ratio of qualified staff to children, as well as volunteer helpers;
- has the chance to join in with other children and adults to live, play, work and learn together;
- is helped to take forward her/his learning and development by being helped to build on what she/he already knows and can do;
- has a personal key person who makes sure each child makes satisfying progress;
- is in a setting that sees parents as partners in helping each child to learn and develop; and
- is in a setting in which parents help to shape the service it offers.

Our setting has a duty under the law to help safeguard children against suspected or actual 'significant harm'. Our employment practices ensure children against the likelihood of abuse in our setting and we have a procedure for managing complaints or allegations against a member of staff.

Our way of working with children and their parents ensures that we are aware of any problems that may emerge and can offer support, including referral to appropriate agencies when necessary, to help families in difficulty.

Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year	Provided pre-school education to in excess of 40 children aged 30 months to school age over 38 weeks of the year in sessional care. Morning sessions run from 8:45 to 11:45 and afternoon sessions run from 12:30 to 15:30. A lunch time session is also provided such that children can stay all day.
	A total of 240 sessions are available per week and the charity provided an average of 225 sessions during this accounting period.
