(7) <u>Fixed Asset – Freehold Property previously owned by the Rotary Club of</u> <u>Epsom Charity Fund</u>

The Freehold Property situated at 38, Andrews Close, Epsom, Surrey, KT17 4EX was purchased by the Rotary Club of Epsom Charity Fund on 6th February 2013 and simultaneously a 125 year lease was gifted to the registered Charity "The Grange", charity registered number 207740 and company registered number 348341. The 125 year lease gifted was for an annual peppercorn rent.

The total original cost of the property - 38, Andrews Close, Epsom, Surrey, KT17 4EX was £521,435. A payment of £32,995 was made in the year of purchase to improve and extend the property. In view of the 125 year lease the value of the property was reduced. A nominal value of the property together with the attachment of the lease is shown in the Accounts as £5,000. Professional advice will be required to obtain the current value of the property taking into account the remaining years of the lease.

INDEPENDENT EXAMINERS' REPORT TO THE TRUSTEES OF THE

ROTARY CLUB OF EPSOM TRUST FUND

I report on the accounts of the Rotary club of Epsom Charity for the year ended 30th June 2018, which are set out on pages 2 to 5 together with notes on page 6 to 8.

Respective responsibilities of the trustees and examiner

The charity's trustees are responsible for the preparation of the accounts. The charity's trustees consider that an audit is not required for this year under the Charities Act 2011 s 144(2) (the 2011 Act) and that an independent examination is needed.

It is my responsibility to:

- examine the accounts under s 145 of the 2011 Act
- follow the procedures laid down in the general Directions given by the Charity Commission under s 145(5)(b) of the 2011 Act; and

Basis of independent examiner's report

My examination was carried out in accordance with the General Directions given by the Charity Commissioners.
