

- To promote the parent/carer's knowledge and awareness of speech, language and communication needs by carrying out research, publishing guidance and resource documents, and delivering training and workshops.
- To promote the health and wellbeing of the parent/carer through counselling support and befriending. To
  relieve burdens and breakdown of parent/carers who have a child with speech, language and
  communication needs through home visiting and home group support.

# **Activities, Achievements & Performance**

Parent Friends is a one of our projects based in London set up to support parents who have a child with speech and language impairments. On the 21<sup>st</sup> January 2016, working in partnership with AFAISIC, we delivered a Speech and Language workshop to parents, carers and teachers at our Canalside offices, London W10.


