Hello and welcome to our annual report we had another good year were usage is concerned but we need to be able to gain some support from a big funded to allow access and participation to more families. This is our 20 year anniversary it gone so fast I can't believe I been running this with my army of volunteers and staff for 20 years but here we are.

Funding News:

The funding again is slow but steady and we hope again by next year to gain some bigger funds and paid staff, as we do each year. We like to thank – Awards for all for their much-needed help with new programs this again has added to the services we can provide.

We also like to thank link 4 life for their continue support over the past 5 years and hope for the arts funding to continue. We also would like to thank peter Kershaw, the act foundation, for their support, thank you all without you lives would not be changing and young disadvantage people and older isolated people would be left in the dark without services we provide, and we can only do that with your help.

With the loss of Janice to the group -Anne is now doing all funding application and will keep us updated with her finding.

The end of 2019 finished with a Christmas show for all the young people and all older members showing us what they have been doing over the past year. It was a great show and this helps with bringing in revenue to start us in the new year thinking about costumes for next year's show Oliver twist. The year 2019 started with our normal session and our lets from Link4 life and dance studios for other private dance are also booked for the full year.

This year seen the theatre show Oliver twist this was well attended with 4 shows of full house in the theatre, the sets, costumes and all who took part thank you the best show so far. Then we when on to produce beauty and the beast again 4 nights of shows which has seen a new

This has been yet another really busy year working with different groups and also renting studios to other new groups helping them to become established. The theatre is getting busy and more usage which is helping with funds but most of all it has had lots of shows and community involvement.

We run summer camp again and again fully booked it proofing to be a must for the young people of Middleton. We had fully booked shows with lots of different showtimes and it brings a new fresh feel to the theatre.

Our usual work has continued with children and young people throughout 2018. 920 children and young people aged 5-25 have attended Popstars this year. We also have had 356 older people using the centre from arts, photography work, plays.

We still take "looked after" children from eight local children's homes /foster homes, in addition to children and young people from Middleton Township and surrounding areas. Some are with us only for a very short time- in some cases only for a single session before they are moved on, whilst others will stay for much longer. Local statistics show that many older (9+) children who have been placed in care are there due to neglect or abuse.

We have decided to keep our session charges at £2/2-hour session. We are very much aware of the impact of benefit changes and the rise in the general cost of living is having on many families who send their young ones to us. Many of these families are one parent and or dependant on benefits. We will also continue our policy of supplying all the costumes for our performances to ensure that every child or young person can participate.

We have allowed free access to the theatre for some charity events helping other raise much needed funds for their cause. This has helped us raise more awareness of our theatre and helped us raise funds from the bar.

We still have employed staff, with a new fund but we still have 5 freelancers delivering sessions and 14 volunteers helping us this year, with the help from the older people sessions. We are very grateful for all their hard work.

We have continued to use the services of trusted and proven tutors —However, finding tutors at the hourly rate prescribed by other funder is becoming a challenge.

MPA has continued to be an active member of the Middleton Cultural and Heritage Working Group, the Rochdale Borough Children, Young People and Families Strategic Group and the Rochdale Arts Forum. We have also been involved in the setting up of the Middleton Town Centre action group.

We are now really looking forward to 2020

1 **BASIS OF PREPARATION**

Basis of accounting

These accounts have been prepared under the historical cost convention with items recognised at cost or transaction value unless otherwise stated in the relevant note(s) to these accounts and in accordance with the Statement of Recommended Practice: Accounting and Reporting by Charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) issued on 16 July 2014

Middleton Popstars Academy of performing Arts meets the definition of a qualifying entity under FRS 102 and has therefore taken advantage of the disclosure exemptions in relation to the presentation of a cash flow statement.

2 **ACCOUNTING POLICIES**

2.2 Income

Income are included in the Statement of Financial Activities (SoFA) when the charity becomes entitled to the resources, it is more likely than not that the trustees will receive the resources, the monetary value can be measured with sufficient reliability.

The value of any volunteer help received is not included in the accounts but is described in the trustees' annual report.

Expenditure and Liabilities

Liabilities are recognised where it is more likely than not that there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to pay out resources and the amount of the obligation can be measured with reasonable certainty.

2.4 **Assets**

Individual fixed assets costing £2,000.00 or more are initially recorded at cost, less any subsequent accumulated depreciation and subsequent accumulated impairment losses.

Depreciation is provided on tangible fixed assets so as to write off the cost or valuation, less any estimated residual value, over their expected useful economic life as follows:
