STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

The charity is constituted as a Charitable Incorporated Organisation (Association model) (CIO) and was registered with the Charity Commission on 31 January 2017. Prior to this it had been an unincorporated charitable association for over 20 years.

Our constitution allows for a maximum of 8 trustees and we currently have 7 in post. Trustees are selected at the AGM. Members are invited to apply before the AGM. Existing trustees may also coopt members to become trustees if vacancies remain after the AGM.

The administration of the charity is carried out by the Director and an Administrator; both are employees and native French speakers. The Director is also an experienced teacher and there are three other part-time teaching staff. In addition, we regularly have post-graduate French students visiting and studying as part of their university courses.

Trustees have continued to attend training seminars for small charities. We have been fortunate to have had trustees with legal, human resources and safeguarding expertise, but we continue to take outside legal, accounting and human resource advice as needed.

During the past year we have reviewed and updated various policies including our Health and Safety and our Safeguarding of Children and Adult policies. We held a training event on safeguarding issues for all trustees and staff in March 2020.

We continue to belong to a wider UK network of Alliance Française organisations, working closely with the Institut Français.

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Alliance Française de York is an educational charity whose aims are: -

To advance the education of the public of York and the surrounding region in French language and culture, in particular but not exclusively by:

- Organising courses in French language, civilisation and literature;
- Promoting social and cultural activities relating to France and for French speakers in York and the surrounding area (such as lectures, musical concerts, drama, exhibitions, film, shows);
- Collaborating with the cultural service of the French Embassy in London;
- Supporting French language teaching and the diffusion of French culture in schools, colleges, and universities.

The Trustees believe they have complied with the duty in Section 17 of the 2011 Charities Act to have due regard to guidance published by the Charity Commission in respect of public benefit.

Volunteers play a significant role in delivering the objectives and activities of the charity. In addition, members volunteer to organise and assist at many of the activities listed below.

ACHIEVEMENTS AND PERFORMANCE

The charity continued to provide language classes to a wide range of student abilities, and supplemented the tuition with lectures and social events dealing with French culture and life, including the following:

- 1. Annual French language and culture courses over 30 weeks 8 weekly courses involving 77 people.
- 2. Summer classes between June and July. Individual (1-2-1) and small group (1-2-2/3/4) courses held throughout the year involving 12 people.
- 3. Occasional family and taster classes.
- 4. Eight monthly evening presentations on French topics, all open to the public.
- 5. Soirée cinema showing French films under licence 8 films shown.
- 6. Café Conversation twice weekly conversation held throughout the year in a local café and led by native French speakers. 81 sessions with an average of 10 people per session.
- 7. Après-midi ludique Christmas games festivity involving 15 people.
- 8. Fool dans un pull Xmas jumpers. We raised money for the local hospice, St Leonards.
- 9. Annual Fête des Rois lunch in January. This year we had 42 members and guests for the traditional French post-Christmas lunch.
- 10. Fête de la Musique we held a charity French music quiz at a local public house in aid of a local children's hospice, Martin House.
- 11. Bastille day we held a widely publicised and well-attended piqnique in a local park to celebrate the 14th July.
- 12. In addition to our regularly updated website, and social media postings, we produce a monthly email newsletter with news of our activities and articles on French culture.

POLICY ON RESERVES

The charity's policy is to ensure that there are sufficient funds to cover liabilities in the event of closure. The charity has no debt, and our only future financial commitments relate to office rent. Our annual accounts show that we paid substantially more this year in rent when compared to previous years. This is due to having to vacate our former low-rent premises by September 2019 and having to find a new location which, necessarily, involved higher, more commercial rents.

In the event of the charity ceasing activities, the current redundancy cost would be approximately £8,600. This is well within our current bank balance of £56,000, which has remained stable for the past few years.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

The charity raises funds only by membership subscription (£25 per year) and payment by individuals for the various activities detailed above. Our income from these sources has remained stable.

Our overall balance was slightly improved by a final payment received from our former landlord in respect of refunded solicitors' fees.

Total receipts in the year amounted to £47,947 (2019 - £51,150) and total payments amounted to £47,407 (2019 - £37,785) giving rise to a net excess of receipts over payments of £540 (2019 - £13,365).

All money raised for the charity is used to provide the activities and for administrative costs. We do not invest money but keep our reserves in a bank savings account, moving money between the current account and the savings account to maximise return on our funds, while ensuring the smooth running of the charity.

IMPACT OF COVID-19

Lockdown began on 23 March 2020. We immediately took steps to convert our activities, where possible, from physical gatherings to online delivery. For example, we moved to online classes and virtual cafés.

The current uncertainty obviously makes it difficult to plan ahead for the new academic year and to begin our usual summer marketing events, but we have been fortunate in having a business model that has meant no furlough/redundancies have been needed to date; we have sufficient reserves; together with other UK Alliances Françaises we have benefited from a small financial grant from the Institut Français to purchase computer hardware/software and Zoom licences to enable us to provide our services online; our loss of income has not been significant, since classes form our main income and the fees for the 30-week courses are paid for at the beginning of the academic year; and a loyal learner base has indicated a willingness to continue with online classes, if this proves to be necessary in the next academic year.

We continue to follow government guidance and to monitor the easement of restrictions, adjusting our processes as appropriate and thinking creatively about how we can deliver our services in new ways.
