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Report of the Trustees for the Year Ended 31 October 2019

The trustees present their report with the financial statements of the charity for the year ended 31 October 2019. The trustees have adopted the provisions of Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2015).

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Objectives and aims

The charity's principle aim is to promote the social inclusion of women and young girls of working age by building their confidence and skills through the provision of advice and support so that they can challenge the barriers to employment opportunities, to provide an empathic environment to relieve emotional hardship and to work with organisations to improve employment opportunities. The Trustees give careful consideration to the Charity's Commission guidelines on public benefit and are satisfied that the charity fulfils the public benefit requirement.

The charity relies on the dedication of volunteers to carry out the work of the charity and in this financial year they have contributed in excess of 900 hours at our drop-in advice and support centre, the 'hub' and more with their outreach and fundraising activities.

Report of the Trustees for the Year Ended 31 October 2019

ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE

Charitable activities

This has been a busy year for the Trust with a couple of long-term projects, whose grants had been given mid-way through the previous financial year: ROSA and Awards for All.

In the past twelve months we have run 23 grant funded workshops/support activities with a total of 301 women booked on them. There is still approximately a 30% drop-out rate which is disappointing but an accepted consequence of providing free workshops. Without a financial investment from the participant it is easier to not attend plus our beneficiaries come from groups that could well find it too anxiety-raising to attend on any particular day, even when they have booked. Where feasible, workshops were linked to the AQA Unit Awards and we registered 11 women during this financial year who were awarded certificates.

The ROSA funded 'Have your Say Days' resulted in the development of the Eastbourne Manifesto for Women which was launched with the support of Eastbourne Chamber of Commerce.

We were accepted as one of the Mayor's Charities for the 2018/19 term and considerable volunteer time was spent in arranging fundraising throughout the year. It was exhausting but resulted in raising awareness of the charity throughout the town and a major donation to us. Our most successful independent fundraiser of the year was the Work and Wellbeing Day held at Eastbourne Town Hall which was also a wonderful team building event for our volunteers. The Assembly Room was packed with female entrepreneurs who were demonstrating goods and services linked to wellbeing whilst in the Court Room, speakers were highlighting the rights and responsibilities of employers and employees in maintaining a healthy working environment. This activity met with our aims of working alongside employers to improve the working environment.

Thanks to the ROSA funding we had a volunteer mentor, Rachel Turner, who gave her support to the Chair for 12 months. They met bi-monthly and Rachel ran an away-day where the Trustees and volunteers considered the 2019/2020 priorities for the charity.

We also welcomed Helen Greaves-Warren as our first patron, who has been a strong and ardent supporter of our work.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

Financial position

The financial statements show a deficit of £580 for this year (2018 - surplus of £4,170).

Reserves policy

The charity's reserves are required and maintained at a level sufficient to ensure the continuance of the charity's objectives.

STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

Governing document

The charity is controlled by its governing document, a deed of trust. The charity was registered as a Charitable Incorporated Organisation (CIO) with the Charity Commission on 31 October 2017.

Recruitment and appointment of new trustees

The Board of Trustees may at any time appoint another individual as a new Trustee by ordinary resolution. The Trustees can consist of at least three with no maximum limit.

Notes to the Financial Statements for the Year Ended 31 October 2019

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of preparing the financial statements

The financial statements of the Charitable Incorporated Organisation, which is a public benefit entity under FRS 102, have been prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102) 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2015)', Financial Reporting Standard 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland' and the Charities Act 2011. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

The presentation currency of the financial statements is the Pound Sterling (£).

Income

All income is recognised in the Statement of Financial Activities once the charity has entitlement to the funds, it is probable that the income will be received, and the amount can be measured reliably.

Expenditure

Liabilities are recognised as expenditure as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to that expenditure, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefits will be required in settlement and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably. Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings, they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

Tangible fixed assets

Tangible fixed assets are stated at cost less accumulated depreciation and accumulated impairment losses. Cost includes costs directly attributable to making the asset capable of operating as intended.

Depreciation is provided on all tangible fixed assets, at rates calculated to write off the cost, less estimated residual value, of each asset on a systematic basis over its expected useful life as follows:

Plant and equipment

33.3% on cost

Taxation

The charity is exempt from tax on its charitable activities.

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statements.
