Contribution made by volunteers	WDSH has no paid employees, so all contributions of time come from volunteers. In addition to the voluntary financial donations contributed by members of the public WDSH also receives contributions of items such as household equipment, bicycles, garden furniture and clothing.

Achievements and Performance

Summary of the main achievements of the charity, identifying the difference the charity's work has made to the circumstances of its beneficiaries and any wider benefits to society as a whole.

Five families of Syrian refugees have settled in West Devon: the first two families arrived in June 2017. WDSH have helped these families to settle and feel secure, not least by being a first point of reference when potential problems arise. We have helped some individuals to find part-time paid employment, which is important for their selfesteem as well as for their income. WDSH has helped three of the families to move from their initial accommodation to new premises, thus helping the family to feel more 'at home' in West Devon. The additional language support sessions not only help to develop the families' English language capabilities but also provide the reassurance that comes from regular contact with friendly faces, though as families become more established WDSH have focused less upon supporting the adults' language and more upon working with schools to support the children's learning.
